- 2 A. Paul Casper, 44095 212th St, Lake Preston, SD 57249
- 3 Q. What is your occupation?
- 4 A. I am a Kingsbury County farmer.
- 5 Q. Please briefly describe your operation.
- 6 A. I have one year of college experience and 55 years of farming experience. Our operation
- 7 includes farm ground. We grow and sell corn every year to Prairie Ag Partners and local ethanol
- 8 plants.
- 9 Q. Please describe your affiliation with Summit, Prairie Ag Partners, and other ethanol
- 10 plants.
- 11 A. Regarding my relationship with the ethanol industry, I sell corn to Prairie Ag Partners and
- 12 other local ethanol plants.
- 13 Q. What is the basis for your testimony?
- 14 A. I seek to see agriculture succeed and to testify that the Summit project is good for
- farmers, ethanol plants, and South Dakota in general.
- 16 Q. Why is the Summit project necessary for you/your neighbors/South Dakota/Ethanol
- 17 A. We had no local market for corn until ethanol plants were established. If we lose those
- markets, we have to ship all of our corn away, opening the doors to unlimited markets.
- 19 Q. What does Summit mean to you in terms of opportunities to grow your operation?
- 20 A. We grow and sell corn in order to protect, evolve, and maintain our way of life.
- 21 Q. What context is missing from the concerns stated by others?
- 22 A. Ethanol buys and uses a tremendous amount of corn and has done great to keep our local
- 23 basis intact.

- 1 Q. What fears do you have if the project is not completed?
- 2 A. My biggest fear is that we would not be competitive in the energy market.
- 3 Q. Has your county acted against the project?
- 4 A. No.
- 5 Q. How do you feel about that? How do you feel about other counties which have tried
- 6 to stop the project?
- 7 A. The only way to function as a county is to raise taxes or be fortunate enough to get new
- 8 businesses or homes built.
- 9 Q. Do you have safety concerns about the Summit project?
- 10 A. No.
- 11 Q. Is your ground part of the Summit project?
- 12 A. No.
- 13 Q. How was your easement experience? Were you fairly treated and compensated?
- 14 A. My ground is not part of the Summit project. Therefore, I have not had any experience
- with the easements.
- 16 Q. Does your ground currently have other easements?
- 17 A. Yes. My ground has easements with natural gas, rural water, and fiber optics.
- 18 Q. What has been your overall experience with easements, both Summit and others?
- 19 A. My experience with easements has been generally good.
- 20 Q. Does this conclude your testimony?
- 21 A. Yes.
