1	Q.	Please state your name and business address for the record.	
2	A.	My name is Ronald C. Alverson. My address is 24212 459th Avenue, Chester, SD 57016.	
3	Q.	What is your occupation?	
4	A.	I am a Lake County farmer and shareholder at several SD Ethanol Plants.	
5	Q.	Please briefly describe your operation.	
6	A.	I have a BS Degree in Agronomy from South Dakota State University and have 50 years	
7	of exp	perience in various facets of Crop Production. Our operation includes irrigated and rainfed	
8	corn a	and soybean production. We grow and sell corn every year to Dakota Ethanol and soybeans	
9	to South Dakot Soybean Processors.		
10	Q.	Please describe your affiliation with Summit and Dakota Ethanol?	
11	A.	I sell corn to and was a founder of Lake Area Corn Processors/Dakota Ethanol in 1999. I	
12	am still on the Board of Directors of Dakota Ethanol.		
13	Q.	What is the basis for your testimony?	
14	А.	I seek to see agriculture, Summit, and ethanol succeed and to testify that the Summit	
15	projec	et is good for farmers, ethanol plants, and South Dakota in general.	
16	Q.	Why is the Summit project necessary for you/your neighbors/South	
17	Dako	ta/Ethanol?	
18	A.	Markets/Consumers are asking for and paying premiums for low carbon products.	
19	Companies that cannot or do not choose to produce what markets/consumers want will not have		
20	access	s to those growing premium low-carbon markets. The Summit Carbon Solutions CO <sub>2</sub>	
21	pipeline will enable a 50% carbon intensity reduction in Dakota Ethanol's fuel ethanol and co-		
22	produ	cts.	
23	Q.	What does Summit mean to you in terms of opportunities to grow your operation?	

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A. We grow and sell low-carbon corn to Dakota Ethanol in order to protect, evolve, and
 maintain our way of life.

#### **3 Q.** What context is missing from the concerns stated by others?

It has been estimated by multiple Grain Marketing Economists that the Ethanol Industry 4 A. 5 has improved corn price basis by approximately 40 cents per bushel over the past two decades. 6 Every corn producer in the State has benefited from that as well as producers of other crops because those other crop prices have had to rise to compete with corn for acreage in SD. Also, it 7 8 has been estimated that roughly 8,000 farm families have directly invested in Ethanol Plants in 9 SD. Value-added profits from those Ethanol Plants have been distributed to those shareholders. Economists have estimated that the total value added to corn (corn price basis, value-added 10 profits, and Ethanol company share price appreciation) are in the neighborhood of 60 to 80 cents 11 per bushel in SD! 12

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#### Q. What fears do you have if the project is not completed?

A. It has been estimated that about 40% of the current US Ethanol Companies have the
opportunity to capture and sequester corn starch fermentation CO<sub>2</sub> without a pipeline. Ethanol
Companies that cannot capture and sequester CO<sub>2</sub> without a pipeline to transport CO<sub>2</sub> will be
shut out of the growing low-carbon fuel and food (ethanol co-products) markets and gradually
become unviable.

19 Q. Has your county acted against the project?

20 A. No

21 Q. How do you feel about other counties which have tried to stop the project?

22 A. It is very short-sighted.

23 Q. Do you have safety concerns about the Summit project?

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1	A.	Yes, but no more so than other pipelines. $CO_2$ pipelines were first constructed in the	
2	1970	s in the Southern United States, and there are now more than 5,000 miles of CO <sub>2</sub> pipeline in	
3	operation. There has never been a fatality caused by a CO <sub>2</sub> pipeline rupture.		
4	Q.	Is your ground part of the Summit project?	
5	A.	My ground is not part of the Summit project.	
6	Q.	Does your ground currently have other easements?	
7	A.	Yes. My ground currently has easements for water and sewer lines.	
8	Q.	What has been your overall experience with easements, both Summit and others?	
9	A.	My general experience with easements has been good.	
10	Q.	Does this conclude your testimony?	
11	A.	Yes.
