I just read on the SDPUC website "Pipeline Siting Information Guide" that the applicant (Summit Carbon Solutions) has the burden of proof to:

1. Comply with all applicable laws and rules.
2. Will not pose a threat of serious injury to the environment nor to the social or economic conditions of inhabitants or expected inhabitants in the siting area.
3. Will not substantially impair the health, safety or welfare of the inhabitants and
4. Will not unduly interfere with the orderly development of the region with due consideration have been given to the views of the government bodies of affected local units of government.

In the 6 evidentiary hearings you held for industrial wind projects from May 2018 through February of 2020, the same criteria were used for the wind project applicants. But, in each of the 6 wind projects, now all in operation, there is proof of:

Health effects from the infrasound put off by the wind turbines.

Absolutely the wind turbines interfere with the orderly development of the region because nobody will ever build a home even remotely close to a wind turbine.

As far as affecting the social conditions, we have people in our community who were once friends that will never speak to each other again because of their disagreement on industrial wind projects.

Now, if you think of the pipeline, and how dangerous it is because it suffocates people and animals if they are within a certain distance from a break, of course it's a threat of serious injury. It's been proven in Mississippi and other places. And I could go on and on.

So with the wind project permits, **which you permitted every one**, and now with the responsibility of health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the people affected by the pipeline, what criteria is the PUC actually using? I suspect it's the political and lobbying power of the Green New Deal that makes you choose time after time to be on the side of the big corporations and always 100% voting against the people of South Dakota, who you are supposed to represent.
