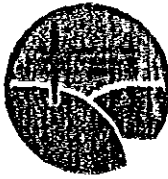

JOINT REQUEST FOR ELECTRIC SERVICE TERRITORY EXCEPTION

Sioux Valley Empire Electric Association (SVEEA) and Northern States Power Company (NSP) jointly request an exception to the existing electric service territorial agreement to permit Northern States Power Company to provide electric service to the proposed South Dakota Department of Transportation lighting service located at the intersection of SD Highways 30 and 11 in the SW 1/4 of Section 13 and the NE 1/4 of Section 24, T101N, R49W, Minnehaha County. This service consists of six 400 watt, high pressure sodium light fixtures, two of which are located in the service territory assigned to NSP and four of which are located in the service territory assigned to SVEEA. A drawing of the general area, proposed lighting facilities and service territory boundary is attached for your information.

Representatives of both SVEEA and NSP have met on several occasions and discussed different ways of serving this load. It is our mutual conclusion, that in this instance, the customer's interests will be best served by receiving service from one power supplier. We have agreed that in this instance it should be NSP, and that we should request an exception to the existing territorial agreement.

We have also agreed that each such instance where territory boundaries become a factor should be dealt with on an individual basis.

As stated above, the decision by SVEEA to consent to NSP providing service to this installation was influenced by the fact that the customer's interests will be best served through a single metering point.

This consent on the part of SVEEA is limited to the said SD Department of Transportation lighting service request and will automatically terminate upon removal or abandonment of such service.

This exception is not to be construed as having any impact upon or indicating a desire to change the service areas assigned by the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission.

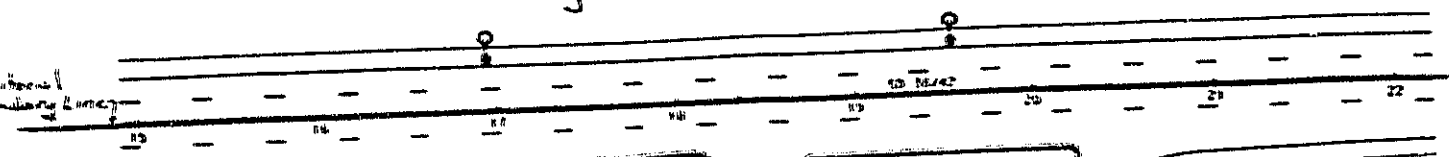

NSP Territory

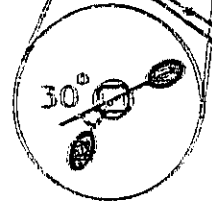
Residential

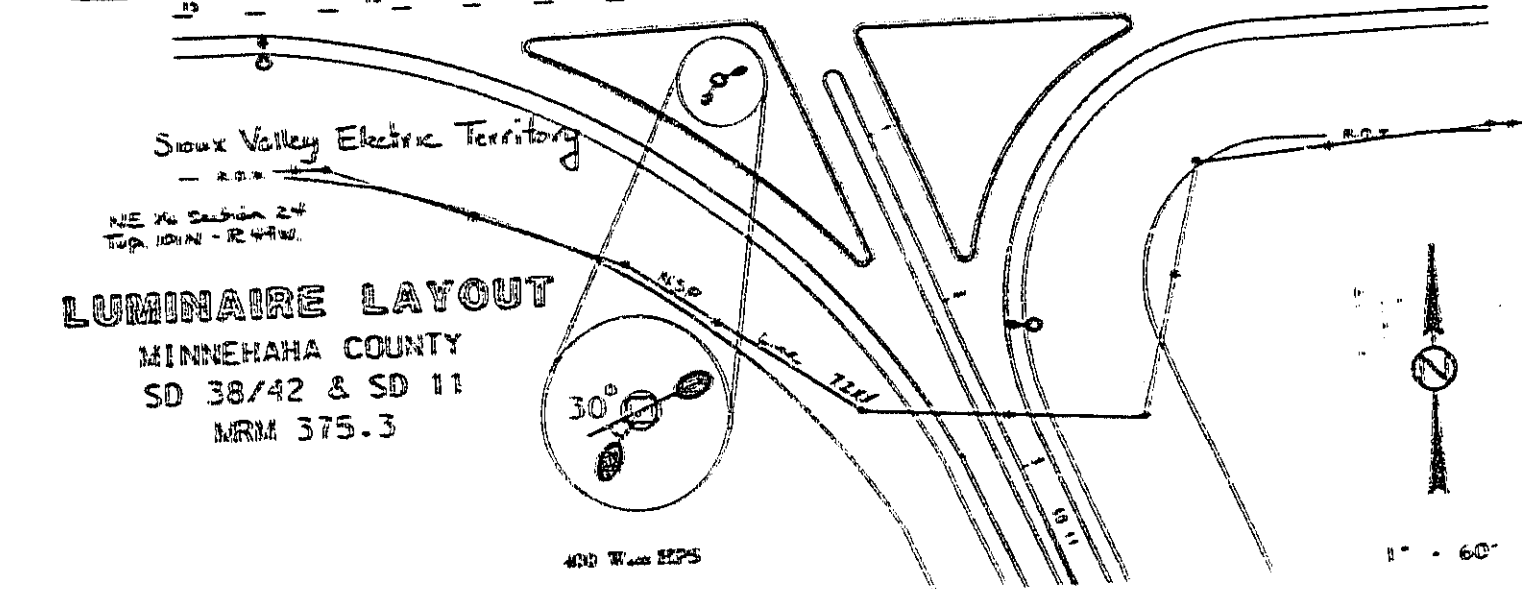

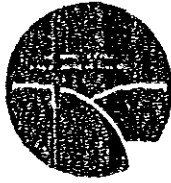



Dear Mr. Wilcox:

This letter is to document our phone conversations this past week regarding the State's position on the maintenance of the proposed roadway lighting at the intersection of SD 38/SD 42 and SD 11 South.

The State has no preference as to which utility company provides power and maintenance of the roadway lighting at the intersections to be lighted with the above referenced project. However, the Department prefers that the power and maintenance at each intersection be provided by only one utility company. These issues must be settled between the utility companies having facilities at the intersections.

Conversations between Northern States Power, Sioux Valley Electric, and Department of Transportation personnel to date have indicated that Northern States Power will be providing the power and maintaining the bulbs for the six luminaires on a routine basis at the intersection of SD 38/SD 42 and SD 11 South. Any future major repair of the roadway lights (pole replacement, luminaire replacement, etc.) will be negotiated with Northern States Power if and when the repair is required.

In the near future, the Department of Transportation will send form DOT-121, Review Certification and Agreement Record and attachments for signature. The Review Certification and Agreement Record will specify that power and bulb maintenance of the roadway lighting is to be provided by Northern States Power.

If you know of information contrary to the above please advise.

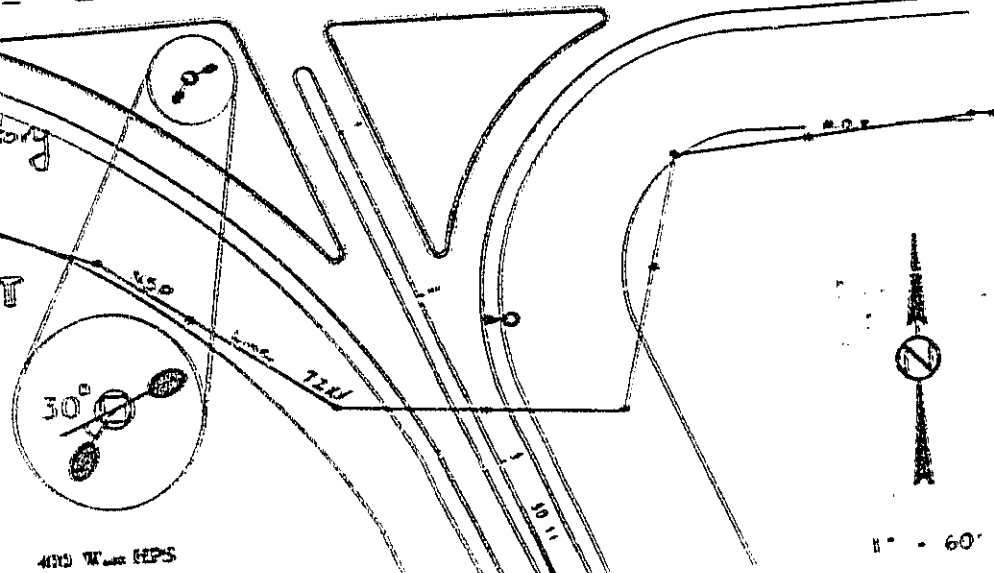

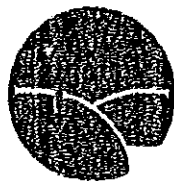
LUMINAIRE LAYOUT
