The Brookings County Commission would like to go on record in support of wind energy. Specifically the matter of EL-07-018 pertains to wind energy development in Brookings County. The Commission speaking as one body recommends that the Minn-Dakota Project be treated as one wind farm and Buffalo Ridge I be treated as a separate wind farm.

The Brookings County Planning Commission has heard both projects and granted Conditional Use Permits for each project separately.
