SERVICE TERRITORY EXCEPTION AGREEMENT BETWEEN **XCEL ENERGY AND CENTRAL ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE**

SOUTH DAKOTA PUBLIC **UTILITIES COMMISSION**

Central Electric Cooperative and Xcel Energy jointly agree to allow Xcel Energy provide electric service to a home located at 23405 439th Av, near Howard, SD. The home is located within Central Electric Cooperative's electric service territory in the NW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 17 of Clearwater Township T106N R55W in Miner County, South Dakota. This parcel is immediately southwest of the intersection of 439th Avenue and 234th Street.

While this parcel of land resides within the existing Central Electric Cooperative Electric Service Territory as established in 1975 by the South Dakota Legislature and codified in SDCL 49-34A-42, Xcel Energy electric facilities are more conveniently located relative to providing service to this customer. Central Electric Cooperative facilities are over one mile distant, while Xcel Energy has an existing 12.5KV power line running along 234th Street that can be easily tapped into in order to provide service to this customer.

A drawing of the service site is attached to this agreement as exhibit A. David Callies, customer, desires that Xcel Energy connect this facility and serve the electrical load.

Central Electric Cooperative and Xcel Energy have concluded that, in this instance, the customer's interests will be best service by receiving service from Xcel Energy and have agreed to this exception to the existing territorial agreement.

We also agree that each such instance where territory boundaries become a factor will be dealt with on an individual basis.

This consent on the part of Central Electric Cooperative is limited to the said service to the residence described and this territory exception will automatically terminate upon removal or abandonment of such service.

This exception is not to be construed as having any impact upon or indicating a desire to change the service areas assigned by the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission.

The Parties agree to jointly submit these agreed upon changes to the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission for approval.
