



Crocker Wind Farm
Compliance Filing – Condition 31

Crocker Wind Farm, LLC (“Crocker”) provides the following information required pursuant to paragraph 31 of the Permit Conditions approved by the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”) and included as Attachment A to its June 12, 2018 Final Decision and Order Granting Permit to Construct Facilities and Notice of Entry in Docket EL 17-055.

31. *Within 90 days of the Project’s completion of each phase, Applicant shall submit a report to the Commission that provides the following information:*

- a) *As-built location of structures and facilities, including drawings clearly showing compliance with the setbacks required by state and local governments and the voluntary commitments set forth in Table 8-1 of the Application.*

Crocker: As-built maps providing the information required in subpart (a) are provided as **Attachment A**.

- b) *The status of remedial activities for road damage, landowner property damage, crop damage, environmental damage, or any other damage resulting from Project construction activities*

Crocker: Information regarding each category identified in subpart (b) is provided below:

- Road Damage: Three out of the four townships within the Project have provided certificates of completion (Ash, Warren, and Woodland Townships – please see **Attachment B**). The Road Use and Repair Agreements for Spring Valley Township and Clark County are in place and being followed, with final work and certificates of completion to be executed in the spring of 2020.
- Landowner Property Damage: Property restoration activities began in 2019 following construction activities in each given area. Restoration activities are approximately 30 percent complete with activities scheduled to commence in the spring of 2020 when weather allows. Crocker anticipate site restoration activities of grading, seeding, fence repair and other activities to be complete in Q2 2020 with ongoing monitoring.

Fences impacted during construction have been repaired with temporary fencing during construction and will be repaired to long term fencing solutions at the same time as restoration activities are completed this spring.

- Crop Damage: Crocker anticipates 2019 crop damage reimbursements will be complete this spring. The damaged areas have been surveyed and reimbursements have been calculated. Project representatives are in the process of meeting with landowners/tenants to sign off on damage reimbursement and anticipate this process and reimbursement to landowners will be complete by March 2020.



- Environmental Damage: Restoration of areas impacted by construction activities has been completed or will be completed in the spring of 2020. No long-term environmental damage has occurred.

c) *A summary of known landowner complaints and Applicant's plan for resolving those complaints*

Crocker: We have no outstanding landowner complaints.
