

MILLARD F. GREELEY (Republican), was born in Kennebec County, Maine, on the 6th of November, 1851. In 1882 he settled on a farm in Deuel County, Dakota, devoting special attention to sheep raising. Greeley was the first secretary of the South Dakota Wool Growers' Association and also served as president. He also served on the board of regents in 1901. Politically a Republican, Mr. Greeley was elected in 1889 as Representative to the first South Dakota Legislature and in 1896 was sent to the state Senate during which session he was elected, by his party, its President Pro tem and was prominently mentioned for the United States senate. He came within a few votes of being nominated for Governor. On December 29, 1877, Mr. Greeley was married to Miss Agnes Blair; they had a son, Ronda Blair.
