Hi Kristen.

Attached is a shapefile of records within the SD Natural Heritage Database occurring within or adjacent to the project boundaries you provided. During the export process from the Database one of the fields, EO\_data, is too large to include as an field in the shapefile attribute table. In order to access this information, records are also exported into a tabular form in the attached Word document. To match the records between the two formats you can use the EO\_ID field which is a unique identifier for each species record

The search resulted in only two listed species, the Dakota Skipper (Federal Threatened Butterfly) and Powesheik Skipperling (Federal Endangered Butterfly). The remaining species are considered rare in the state. Rare species are those that are declining and restricted to limited habitat, peripheral to a jurisdiction, isolated or disjunct due to geographic or climatic factors, or that are classified as such due to lack of survey data.
