US Code Title 42 Section 1983 Civil Action for Deprivation of Rights

Every <u>person</u> who, under color of any statute, ordinance, regulation, custom, or usage, of any <u>State or Territory</u> or the District of Columbia, subjects, or <u>causes</u> to be subjected, any citizen of the United <u>States</u> or other <u>person</u> within the jurisdiction thereof to the deprivation of any rights, privileges, or immunities secured by the Constitution and laws, shall be liable to the party injured in an action at law, suit in equity, or other proper proceeding for redress, except that in any action brought against a judicial officer for an act or omission taken in such officer's judicial capacity, injunctive relief shall not be granted unless a declaratory decree was violated or declaratory relief was unavailable. For the purposes of this section, any Act of Congress applicable exclusively to the District of Columbia shall be considered to be a statute of the District of Columbia.

Deuel County Ordinance Section 504.8 <u>Reapplication.</u> No applicant requesting a special exception permit whose application includes the same or substantially the same requirements for the same or substantially the same property which has been denied by the Board of Adjustment shall be again considered by the Board of Adjustment before the expiration date of six (6) months from the date of the final action on the petition.

All over the country and world, there are significant problems being created by wind turbines, the numbers are too big to ignore

Health problems, sleep deprivation, infrasound, babies crying when wind turbines are operational, people having to abandon their homes, even deformed animals.

There has been much research and more is being done all the time.

A significant study done in Australia, paid for by the energy company, Pacific Hydro, acoustician Steven Cooper found that people were able to sense when the turbines were running even without being able to hear or see them. These people had previously complained about the turbines affecting their health but many did not believe them, or thought the complaints were just because of the annoyance of seeing the turbines.
