On March 8, 2022, the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a filing from Northern States Power Company dba Xcel Energy (Xcel) requesting approval of its 2021 Economic Development Annual Report and 2022 Economic Development Budget. The filing includes Xcel's report on the 2021 budgeted and actual economic development expenses and provides documentation of the actual expenses incurred. The filing also details a proposed economic development budget for 2022.

On March 10, 2022, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of March 25, 2022, to interested individuals and entities on the Commission's PUC Weekly Filings electronic listsery. No petitions to intervene or comments were filed.

The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapter 49-34A, specifically, SDCL 49-34A-4 and 49-34A-6.

At its regularly scheduled meeting on April 14, 2022, the Commission considered this matter. After reviewing the report and plan, the Commission found the activities and contributions set forth therein to be just and reasonable and voted unanimously to approve Xcel's 2021 Economic Development Report and the 2022 Economic Development Budget. It is therefore

ORDERED, that Xcel's 2021 Economic Development Report and 2022 Economic Development Budget are approved as filed.
