Group talks up all-terrain wheelchairs

Access Ability Wisconsin aims to put one in every county across the state

Twelveyearshavepassed, but Mon-ica Spaeni of Mineral Point, Wisconsin, remembers the moment as clearly as

remembers the moment as clearly as any in her life.

"Wow!" said Spaen1, 59, recalling the 2012 experience of using an all-terrain wheelchair. It was eye-opening and afforded me a freedom! thought! might never have again. I knew! I wasn't going to let that go, either."

Spaent, who was paralyzed from the walst down in a 2001 sking accident, had been restricted to paved or other relatively flat surfaces in her traditional wheelchair.

But the all-terrain wheelchair was powered by an electric motor and

powered by an electric motor and equipped with tracks similar to a tank. It allowed Spaeni to travel independently allowed Spaent to travel independently that day across a grassy and stubble-filled field on a pheasant hunt as her husband, Steve, walked nearby. And for the first time in years on an outdoor excursion, Monica Spaeni said, her husband wasn't worried about her

safety.
"It was like I found a new pair of hik-ing boots," Spaeni said. "It opened a door for me."

door for me."
Others, too.
In 2013, Spaeni was one of the founding members and is current board president of Access Ability Wisconsin, a nonprofit formed to provide opportunities for individuals with mobility chal-

ties fer individuals with mobility chal-lenges to enjoy nature and outdoor rec-reational experiences, its motto is "Out-doors Access 4 All."
Thegroup is working with partners to purchase and place all-terralin wheel-chairs in each county of Wisconsin. As of this spring, it had reached 32. Under AAW stypical arrangement, the all-terrain wheelchair and a trailer sea bested by a local cranination of its

celebration June 1 in Madison to help raise awareness for all-terrain wheelchairs, promote opportunities for peo-ple to use them and attract more partners in its quest to have the equipment

ners in its quest to have the equipment statewide. Traditional wheelchairs aren't often stable enough for safe movement across rugged or uneven ground and aren't suited to travel over sand, gravel or long

grass.

But the right piece of equipment can make a world of difference for those with physical challenges.

Think of the all terrain wheelchair as the off-road alternative among wheel-

The all-terrain wheelchairs have five speeds and can travel as fast as 5 mph. Standard models feature a joystick and push buttons for controls but can also be fitted with a 'puffer' for people without the use of their hands.

the use of their hands.
The ability to adjust the seat position
— from tilted slightly forward to a deep
recine— adds a measure of comfort and
safety. When going uphill, the user can
tilt forward. If going downhill, it can be
adjusted backward. The chair can also
turn in a tight radius.

Critical to those who spend theirday in a chair, the movements also allow the user to change positions and alleviate of the all-tuser to change positions and alleviate of the control of user to change positions and alleviate pressure points on the tailbone, back and thighs.

With an electric power source, the chair runs quiet as a whisper. When fully charged, the batteries can runthe chair constantly for many hours.

Spaeni said the chairs aren't only for

those unable to walk. They can be used by anyone, perhaps through age, injury or disease, who has difficulty navigating trails or other outdoor terrain.

trails or other outdoor terrain.
The uses of an all-terrain wheelchair are virtually unlimited.
Spaent, for example, recently used one on an outing to find and pick mored mushrooms and prune trees. The equipment was used in April by Justin Ninedof as he tagged a wild turkey near Osson

seo, And last September Randall Sonnen-berg of Watertown used an all-terrain wheelchaft to learn fly casting.

At a July 2022 event to mark the placement of an all-terrain wheelchair at Wehr Nature Center in Franklin, Dar-

at Wehr Nature Center in Pranklin, Darrin Malsack, then 45, and his daughter
Sofia, 5, both of Milwaukee, drove on the
grounds on Dartni's camouflage-colored all-terrain wheelchair.
Dartin, who is paralyzed from the
chest down, sald he had a plow attachment for his all-terrain wheelchair
which he used to clear snow from his
diveway.

The benefits of the all-terrain wheelchair extended to his daughter, Dartin said.

"It really helps herget outdoors with me," he said. "I'd say it's as much forher

Spaeni said the value of the equip

Spaeni said the value of the equip-ment is multiplied many times through the mental and physical health benefits it provides to users and their families. "When we started, we said helping people with physical challenges get out-doors was very important," Spaeni said. 'And of course that's true. But we also now know it increases independence

and decreases depression, it's a mental health solution, too." Spaeni said AAW has helped more families get out together and helped increase social connections in communi

rease social connections in communi-ties.
"If you are stuck inside for any rea-son, it's no fun," Spaeni said. "These all-terrain wheelchairs can be a life chang-er."

er.

AAW has grown substantially in all aspects over the last decade. It has gone from one all-terrain wheelchair in Dane County to at least one in 32 counties. By the end of 2024, Spaenl expects to add the end of 2024, Spacell expects to add two more counties to the list. In 2023 AAW was at 44 events, Spaeni said. And the organization now has two full-time employees, including a certified recre-ational therapist.

The biggest challenge in scaling up is cost. Spaeni said an all-terrain wheel-

chair and trailer runs about \$25,000.

"We're working on new partnerships and grant programs," Spaeni said. "It's a chailenge but you know that never stopped us before. Our goal is to get them Inall 72 counties in Wisconsin and we're not chapping." we're not changing."
