

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES OF RATES AND CHARGES

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on February 19, 2026, Black Hills Power, Inc. d/b/a Black Hills Energy (“Black Hills Power”) filed an application with the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”) for an increase in its electric rates and other tariff changes for service to its South Dakota electric customers. Black Hills Power seeks to implement the proposed rates following the disposition of the case, or no later than 180 days hereafter, subject to refund.

Black Hills Power is seeking an annual revenue requirement increase of \$50,553,697. The actual impact of the requested rate increase on individual customer bills will vary depending on the customer’s rate class and amount of energy used. Based on this request, a typical residential customer using an average of 650 kilowatt-hours (kWh) of power each month will see an increase of \$25.13 per month, or 25.4 percent. The increase experienced by commercial and industrial customers will vary depending on rate class, load factor, and amount and nature of use.

This notice was included as part of Black Hills Power’s Application to the Commission. The actual amount of the final rate adjustments will be determined by the Commission, and such amounts could be greater or less than initially requested.

Under South Dakota Codified Law (SDCL § 49-34A-12), a customer has a right to join with 24 other customers and file a written objection to such rate increases and may request the Commission to suspend the rate increase and to hold a public hearing to determine if such rate increase should be allowed.
