In no case shall Keystone return the excavated fossils to the trench. If a qualified and BLM-permitted paleontologist, SDSM PALEONTOLOGIST, OR PALEONTOLOGIST APPOINTED BY THE LANDOWNER, in consultation with the landowner, BLM, or SDSM determines. . . ."
