Due to soil and weather conditions, crews mobilized to Iowa to allow sufficient time for the right-of-way to dry prior to returning to South Dakota. As a result, compliance monitoring and supporting activities was restricted during this reporting period. Site-work and the installation of cathodic protection continue at various mainline valve sites. The percent complete for punchlist items along Spreads 4, 5, and 6 are 81.5%, 97.4%, and 100%, respectively.
