Authorization Code - A numerical code, one or more of which may be assigned to a Customer, to enable the Company to identify the origin of the Customer so it may rate and bill the call. Automatic number identification (ANI) is used as the authorization code wherever possible.

SECTION 3 - DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE

3.1 Computation of Charges

- 3.1.1 The total charge for each completed call may be a variable measured charge dependent on the duration, distance and time of day of the call. The total charge for each completed call may also be dependent only on the duration of the call, i.e. a statewide flat rate per minute charge. The variable measured charge is specified as a rate per minute which is applied to each minute. All calls are measured in increments as set forth in the Rates Section of this tariff. All calls are rounded up to the next whole increment.
- 3.1.2 Where mileage bands appear in a rate table, rates for all calls are based upon the airline distance between the originating and terminating , ints of the call, as determined by the vertical and horizontal coordinates associated with the exchange (the area code and three digit central office code) associated with the originating and terminating telephone numbers. If the Customer obtains access to the Company's network by a dedicated access circuit, that circuit will be assigned an exchange for rating purposes based upon the Customer's main telephone number at the location where the dedicated access circuit terminates. The vertical and horizontal (V & H) coordinates for each exchange and the airline distance between them will be determined according to industry standards.

3.1.3 Timing begins when the called station is answered and two way communication is possible, as determined by standard industry methods generally in use for ascertaining answer, including hardware answer supervision in which the local telephone company sends a signal to the switch or the software utilizing audio tone detection. Recognition of answer supervision is the responsibility of the Underlying Carrier. Timing for each call ends when either party hangs up. The Company will not bill for uncompleted calls.

When billing functions on behalf of the Company or its intermediary are performed by local exchange telephone companies or others, the payment of charge conditions and regulations of such companies and any regulations imposed upon these companies by regulatory bodies having jurisdiction apply. The Company's name and toll-free telephone number will appear on the Customer's bill.

3.5 Service Offerings

3.5.1 1+ Dialing

This service permits Customers to originate calls via switched or dedicated access lines, and to terminate intrastate calls. The customer dials "1+" followed by "ten digits" or dials "101XXXX" followed by "1+ ten digits".

3.5.2 Travel Cards

On February 2, 2001, Fourth and Fifth Amendments to the interconnection agreement between Owest Corporation (Qwest) and DSLnet Communications, LLC (DSLnet) were filed with the Commission for approval. The agreement is a negotiated agreement with the parties which was approved by the Commission effective September 23, 1999. According to the parties the Fourth Amendment is made to add Unbundled Loops to the agreement. The Fifth Amendment is made in order to replace the Interim Line Sharing Agreement DSLnet entered into on May 3, 2000, and adds terms, conditions and rates for Line Sharing. Any party wishing to comment on the agreement may do so by fling written comments with the Commission and the parties to the agreement no later than February 22, 2001. Parties to the agreement may he written responses to the comments no later than twenty days after the service of the initial comments.

On February 7, 2001, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission), in accordance with SDCL 49-31-3 and ARSD 20:10 24 02, received an application for a certificate of authority from Gates Communications, Inc. (Gates)

Gates proposes to offer 1+ and 101XXXX outbound dialing. 800/888 toll-free inbound dialing, directory assistance, data services and travel card service. A proposed tariff was filed by Gates. The Commission has classified long distance service as fully competitive.

On February 8, 2001, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of February 23, 2001, to interested individuals and entities. No petitions to intervene or comments were filed and at its March 6, 2001, meeting, the Commission considered Gates' request for a sertificate of authority. Commission Staff recommended granting a certificate of authority, subject to the condition that Gates not offer a prepaid calling card or require deposits or advance payments without prior approval of the Commission. Commission Staff further recommended a warver of ARSD 20:10:24:02(8).

The Commission finds that it has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SOCL Chapter 49-31, specifically 49-31-3 and ARSD 20 10 24 02 and 20 10 24 03. The Commission finds that Gates has met the legal requirements established for the graming of a certificate of authority. Gates has, in accordance with SDCL 49-31-3, demonstrated sufficient technical, financial and managerial capabilities to offer telecommunications services in South Dakota. Further, the Commission finds that there is good cause to waive ARSD 20:10:24:02(8). The Commission approves Gates' application for a certificate of authority, subject to the condition that Gates not offer a prepaid calling card or require deposits or advance payments without prior approval of the Commission. As the Commission's firial decision in this matter, it is therefore
