

The Complainant's representative states that for the past three years his client has had numerous billing and service problems with Qwest. He states that payments that have been paid to Qwest have not been fully credited to the Milleniallink account, the accounts have been billed for services that were not authorized and the accounts were wrongfully assessed late fees and interest charges. Complainant's representative also states that because of Qwest's poor service and outages, Milleniallink has lost thousands of dollars in lost customers, business and staff time. He also states that Milleniallink has received little or no credit on their bill for the damages associated with the outages. The representative states that Qwest has also engaged in unfair trade practices when both companies were competitive in the DSL business. On October 16, 2001, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a joint request from James Valley Cooperative Telephone Company (James Valley) and Qwest Corporation (Qwest) for approval of a proposed boundary change. As requested by the customer, Jeff Hoellein, Qwest has agreed to release the customer to James Valley. The customer resides in the Redfield Exchange of Qwest's territory. The customer would like to be served by James Valley Cooperative Telephone Company from its Mellette Exchange. Following data requests from Commission Staff, James Valley and Qwest submitted requests for Amended Certificates of Authority pursuant to SDCL 49-31-69. James Valley and Qwest also requested a waiver of subparagraphs 1 through 7, 9 through 21, and 23 of ARSD 20:10:32:03, as the Commission already has the information needed on file.

The boundary challinge involves Sections 33 and 34, Township 119 North, Range 65 West, which will be added to James Valley's Mellette Exchange and deleted from Qwest's Redfield Exchange.

On February 5, 2002, at its regularly scheduled meeting, the Commission considered the parties' request for approval of the joint request for a boundary change, the requests for Amended Certificates of Authority, and waiver of subparagraphs 1 through 7, 9 through 21, and 23 of ARSD 20:10:32:03.

The Commission finds that it has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapter 49-31, specifically 49-31-3 and 49-31-69 and ARSD 20:10:32:03. The Commission finds that James Valley and Qwest have met the legal requirements established for the granting of amended certificates of authority. James Valley and Qwest have, in accordance with SDCL 49-31-3 and 49-31-71, demonstrated sufficient technical, financial and managerial capabilities to offer telecommunications services in South Dakota. Further, the Commission finds that there is good cause to waive subparagraphs 1 through 7, 9 through 21, and 23 of ARSD 20:10:32:03. Further, the Commission finds that pursuant to SDCL 49-31-69, the Amended Certificates of Authority shall be granted, that the proposed boundary territory change between James Valley and Qwest is in the public interest and the request shall be granted, and subparagraphs 1 through 7, 9 through 21, and 23 of ARSD 20:10:32:03 shall be waived. As the Commission's final decision in this matter, it is therefore

ORDERED, that the requests for Amended Certificates of Authority shall be granted; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that the proposed boundary territory change between James Valley and Qwest shall be granted; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that subparagraphs 1 through 7, 9 through 21, and 23 of ARSD 20:10:32:03 shall be waived.
