ABOUT MINNESOTA RELAY

Minnesota Relay is a free service providing full telephone accessibility to persons who are deaf, deaf/blind, hard-of-hearing, or speech-disabled. A specially trained communication assistant (CA) facilitates the telephone conversation between a person who has hearing loss or a speech disability and a hearing person. Calls can be made to anywhere in the world (long distance charges apply), 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, with no restrictions on the number, length or type of calls. All calls are strictly confidential and no records of any conversations are maintained.

Minnesota Relay is administered by the Telecommunication Access Minnesota (TAM) program within the Minnesota Department of Commerce. The Minnesota Relay center is located in Moorhead, MN. Minnesota Relay and associated outreach services are provided to the state under contract with Communication Service for the Deaf.

Minnesota Relay is funded through a monthly surcharge on each wired and wireless telephone access line in the state.

For specific instructions on placing or receiving a Minnesota Relay call, please see the instructions on page 9 of this directory or visit the Minnesota Relay website at www.mnrelay.org.

Minnesota Telephone Assistance Plan

The Minnesota Telephone Assistance Plan (TAP) may provide eligible persons with a credit of up to \$1.75 per month on their phone bills. You are eligible for the assistance if participating in one or more of the following programs:

- * Medical Assistance (MA)
- * Food Support (food stamps)
- * Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP)
- * Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
- * Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- * Federal Public Housing Assistance
- * National School Free Lunch Program
- * Under 135% of Federal Poverty level

If you do not qualify under the above criteria, but live on a federally recognized reservation, you can also qualify if you participate in one of the following:

- * Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance

- * Head Start (only for those meeting the income qualifying standard)
- * National School Lunch Program's free lunch program

Officials from Farmers Mutual Telephone and Federated Telephone Visit Legislators

Representatives from Farmers Mutual and Federated Telephone joined approximately seventy-five other telco representatives from across the State of Minnesota for the 2010 Minnesota Telecom Alliance's (MTA) Day on the Hill. This annual event is a key component of MTA's lobbying activities. The importance of constituent contact with the Legislators is a powerful tool to educate legislators and influence legislation. The primary emphasis of this year's Day on the Hill event was to educate our legislators about the impact access reform would have on rural Minnesota.

What are access charges? Access charges are the per minute fees paid by the long distance companies to Farmers and Federated for the use of our network to begin and complete long distance calls.

Why are access charge revenues important to rural customers? Without access charge revenues and other non-customer revenues, the cost of basic service in rural Minnesota would be unaffordable. A typical MTA member company, such as Farmers and Federated, receives in excess of \$125 per line per year in intrastate access revenue from the long distance companies. These revenues allow rural telcos to keep basic service rates affordable.

What is the solution? The present system. The Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (MPUC) has the authority to set access charges. It has been reviewing and adjusting access rates on a case by case basis. The process allows the MPUC to tailor rates to the cost of individual telco rural network costs. A statutory 'solution' or 'reform' would only impose a one-size fits all straight jacket on the MPUC. The solution is to allow the MPUC to continue to set access rates based on 'real world' facts and not an arbitrary wish of the long distance companies.

Legislators Hold Town Hall Meeting at Federated Telephone

Torrey Westrom, District 11A Representative, and Bill Ingebretson, District 11 Senator, met with local residents at a town hall meeting on February 19, 2010. The town hall meeting was held in the Federated Telephone boardroom in Chokio, MN. Community members were able to join in discussions regarding legislative issues with Westrom and Ingebretson.

If you qualify for a Lifeline credit, you will also qualify for the Telephone Assistance Plan (TAP). This program offers a monthly discount on your phone bill, as well.

FEDERAL SURCHARGES TO INCREASE EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2010

Effective April 1, 2010, the amount of the Federal Universal Service Charge (FUSC) appearing on your bill each month will change as a result of an increase in the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) universal service contribution factor from 14.1% to 15.3%. The new FUSC amount is calculated by multiplying the FCC's universal service contribution factor against your interstate access service charges. The federal universal service fund program is designed to help keep local telephone service rates affordable for all customers, in all areas of the United States.

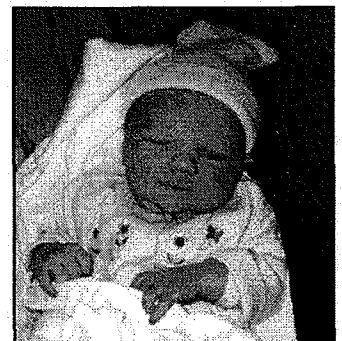

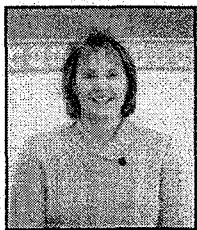

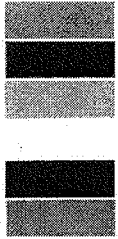
