SECTION 63.71 APPLICATION

Qwest Communications Company, LLC, d/b/a CenturyLink QCC (CenturyLink) hereby applies for authority to discontinue its Broadband Phone Service(s) (BPS) pursuant to Section 63.71 of the Federal Communications Commission's (Commission) rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, and Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214.

CenturyLink is a non-dominant carrier with respect to BPS. CenturyLink submits the following information in support of its application:

1. Name and address of carrier

2. Date of planned service discontinuance

The anticipated date for discontinuing BPS is December 30, 2011, or as soon thereafter as the necessary regulatory approvals can be obtained.

3. Points of geographic areas of service affected

CenturyLink seeks authority to discontinue the provision of BPS in all states where it is currently offered, specifically the states of: Arizona, Colorado, Iowa, Idaho, Minnesota,

Montana, North Dakota, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.

4. Brief description of the type of services affected

BPS is a consumer voice over Internet protocol (VoIP) telephone service offering. It allows consumers to place telephone calls over their broadband Internet service. CenturyLink is discontinuing this offering because it has not been commercially successful. In fact, CenturyLink has fewer than 30 BPS customers in several of the states in which it is offered. Current BPS customers have the option of moving to a comparable voice and long distance offering provided by CenturyLink or switching to a different provider of these services.

5. Brief description of the dates and methods of notice to all affected customers

Attached hereto is a sample of the letters that were sent to all of CenturyLink's BPS customers via U.S. Mail.

6. Dominance of carrier with respect to the service to be discontinued

CenturyLink is a non-dominant carrier in regard to the service to be discontinued.

7. Service

In accordance with 47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a), CenturyLink has mailed a copy of this application to the Governor and public utility commission of each affected state identified in Paragraph 3 above, as well as to the Special Assistant for Telecommunications under the Secretary of Defense.
