**ORDER GRANTING  
CERTIFICATION**

**TC24-032**

On June 28, 2024, the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a filing from Qwest Corporation dba CenturyLink QC (Company) regarding its request for certification regarding its use of federal universal service support. The purpose of this filing was to provide information constituting the Company's plan for the use of its federal universal service support and to otherwise verify that the Company will use all federal universal service support received in a manner that is consistent with the federal universal service provisions of 47 U.S.C. § 254. Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 54.314(a), in order for an eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) to receive support pursuant to the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) high-cost program, a state must file an annual certification with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) and the FCC stating that all federal high-cost support provided to the ETC "was used in the preceding calendar year and will be used in the coming calendar year only for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of facilities and services for which the support is intended."

On July 3, 2024, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of July 19, 2024, to interested individuals and entities on the Commission's PUC Weekly Filings electronic listserv. No parties sought intervention. On August 22, 2024, the Company responded to staff's data request. At its regularly scheduled meeting of August 27, 2024, the Commission considered this matter and deferred it so that the Company could respond to Commissioner questions. On September 4, 2024, Commission staff filed a letter to the Commission regarding consumer affairs contacts. On September 6, 2024, the Company filed responses to Commission questions.

The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapter 49-31 and 47 U.S.C. § 254.

At its regularly scheduled meeting of September 10, 2024, the Commission again considered this matter. The Commission finds that the Company is eligible to receive federal support. The Commission finds that all federal high-cost support provided to the Company was used in the preceding calendar year and will be used in the coming calendar year only for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of facilities and services for which the support is intended. The Commission unanimously voted to approve the Company's request for certification. It is therefore

ORDERED, that the Company is eligible to receive federal support as all federal high-cost support provided to the Company was used in the preceding calendar year and will be used in the coming calendar year only for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of facilities and services for which the support is intended. It is further

ORDERED, that the Commission hereby approves the Company's request for certification.
