TRANSCRIPT OF PROCEEDINGS, held in the above-entitled matter, at the South Dakota State Capitol Building, Room 413, 500 East Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota, on the 9th day of April, 2015. 

CHAIRMAN NELSON: I'm going to call the Public Utilities Commission meeting to order.

This is Chairman Nelson. It's about 3:30 p.m. on April 9. This is an Ad Hoc Meeting of the Public Utilities Commission. Commissioners Fiegen and Hanson are with us on the telephone, along with a number of other parties.

We are dealing with the issue of Docket HP14-001, In the Matter of the Petition of TransCanada Keystone Pipeline, LP for Order Accepting Certification of Permit Issued in Docket HP09-001 to Construct the Keystone XL Pipeline.

And in particular the only issue that we are going to deal with today is the Rosebud Sioux Tribe's Motion for Reconsideration. And I just want to say at the outset, we've got a lot of other motions we're going to deal with on Tuesday. I do not want to get into those today. We are only taking up Rosebud Sioux Tribe's Motion for Reconsideration.

With that, I'm just going to go back through the rollcall again and see if we've got anybody else that's joined us.

Bruce Ellison?

Not hearing Mr. Ellison.

Nancy Hilding?

So I think we've got everybody else who said they were going to call in.

And with that, I'm going to turn it over to Mr. Rappold to make your case.

MR. RAPPOLD: Thank you, Commissioners.

Appreciate the opportunity that you've taken to visit this issue today. Without rehashing everything that we discussed last week, we're pretty much in the same situation as we were last week when we met in Pierre.

And that's why we're asking -- discovery hasn't been completed, and there are, as you said, a number of discovery issues on the table for Tuesday coming up the 14th. It's not our intention to get into those today.

Mr. Taylor and I earlier today through e-mail correspondence discussed this a little bit further. And as you can tell from his response, he has not objected to the requested April 24 deadline for consideration to file Rosebud's testimony.

There's certain things that we're in the process and hoping to get fully disclosed from Keystone. It's necessary for our witnesses to provide testimony in this

case.

So with that said, it's my understanding that we had basically agreed and stipulated, as long as the Commission accepts that agreement, to move the date for Rosebud to April 24 to file its prefiled testimony, which should leave our witnesses ample time to review everything following anything that may be required to be compelled following the hearing on the 14th for our purposes.

Mr. Taylor, can you -- did I state everything that we spoke about earlier through e-mail to your understanding?

MR. TAYLOR: Commissioners, William Taylor.

We said yesterday at 3:30 or something, shortly after the Motion was filed, we have no objection to an extension of the Rosebud Sioux's opportunity to file its expert witness prefiled testimony on the 24th, provided that we don't have to file our rebuttal testimony until the 5th of May, the day the hearing starts.

MR. RAPPOLD: And I confirmed with Mr. Taylor that we don't have any objection to their request to May 5 for rebuttal.

CHAIRMAN NELSON: So it appears that both of you -- this is Commissioner Nelson. It appears that both of you are in agreement on extending those two dates; is

that correct? 1 MR. RAPPOLD: Yes. 2 3 MR. TAYLOR: Yes. As to expert witnesses. 4 MR. RAPPOLD: And just for clarity, we're asking 5 for all of our witnesses. There may be some additional 6 information that could be received from TransCanada 7 following the Tuesday hearing that would be necessary for 8 our other testimony as well. CHAIRMAN NELSON: But, Mr. Rappold, and I wanted 10 to ask this question anyway, my understanding of the 11 Order that we issued last week is that any of that 12 information would be able to be included in your rebuttal 13 testimony filing by the 27th. 14 Is that your understanding? 15 MR. RAPPOLD: That's my understanding of the 16 Order that issued last week, your Honor. 17 But, sir, the issue here, and I don't want to 18 get into the discovery portion of all of this, is one of 19 the things -- but I need to say a little bit in order to

One of the documents that we've been waiting for is an elevation profile from TransCanada. We were sent something I believe it was shortly after I filed the Motion yesterday purporting to be elevation profiling. We're reviewing that. Not certain at this time that

properly address your question.

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we're satisfied with the response.

And so, you know, that's a main issue here is that we need, you know, an accurate elevation profile consistent with what we've asked for in their Interrogatories in order to file the testimony.

So it's not something that would, you know, lend itself good to filing testimony on Friday and then having to go back and redo and extend those additional resources to incorporate testimony based on the elevation profiles. That's why we did it this way.

CHAIRMAN NELSON: And I understand that. But just so that I am clear and we're on the same page, if that elevation information proves not to be sufficient and if -- and I'm making a lot of hypotheticals here -- on Tuesday we were to issue a -- we were to agree with you and issue a Motion to Compel and that information was ultimately provided to you by the 17th, you would be able to utilize that as part of your rebuttal testimony by the 27th; correct?

MR. RAPPOLD: I think it will be part of our direct testimony. Yeah. It would be part of our direct testimony.

CHAIRMAN NELSON: And based on what you've asked for today, that would certainly be workable. But I think in the alternative, based on our Motion from last week,

you'd also be able to include it in your rebuttal.

Now I'm going to go to Mr. Taylor and ask him is what I have stated your understanding also?

MR. TAYLOR: Excuse me. I don't have much of a voice today, Mr. Nelson.

Our proposition is is that if Mr. Rappold has expert witness testimony that he needs more time to file, we're agreeable to give him until the 24th to file his expert witness testimony, experts being persons who have scientific or some other special knowledge, qualifications, and who want to render an opinion as to an issue. So we're amenable to him having until the 24th to file expert witness testimony.

If he has lay persons who he wants to file testimony on, that's a different story. So expert witness testimony by the 24th. We'll supply our rebuttal to the expert witness testimony on or before the day the hearing starts.

Any issues that are resolved on the 14th, issues that relate to lay discovery or -- I said that wrong.

I'm sorry.

Issues that relate to discovery on the 14th we'll just have to address those on the 14th when they play out.

CHAIRMAN NELSON: Okay. That's fair enough.
