stated, by their own rules and federal laws they had to come out and take a CO2 reading, which they did not do, even though they say they did. I have two witnesses that will stand right in front of you and everybody else and say they didn't take a reading.

Mid-America only has the gas man stating it's my job, I went out there, I did what was right. Well, he didn't do what was right. He shut it off stating it's the wrong type of furnace, and for that alone I'm going to shut you off. That was his statement to my wife and myself, at which point he red-tagged my meter saying I was very angry to the company. You bet I am. The fact is that they were wrong for what they did and Mid-America wants to get away with it because they're a large company compared to what I am. I'm just a disabled little veteran out here raising five people on a pension that isn't very much. But I make it go every month for five people.

Now Mid-America comes in my home because somebody called them out of vengefulness and says you got a bad furnace. They come in, they don't take a reading, according to their own law, which they tell me on the phone we need to take a reading

times, the secretary instead said I don't even want to deal with him. Well, excuse me. I thought that's what they were there for.

The fact is the statement that they gave me is "Our serviceman placed the furnace on its backside in order to better inspect the heat exchanger" -- chambers, excuse me. "They used a mirror and flashlight and located cracks in top of heat chamber."

Now that's not what they told me the day they were here in my garage inspecting it nor is it the statement that I expected from KPH when the boss said -- that was Tom said, Well, we'll write you up a statement. In fact they didn't want to get involved even.

The fact is if it's written on paper I guess that makes it all right because then it must be true because seeing is not believing nowadays. And if seeing is believing, then I'd suggest that I propose to all of you people I have the furnace here in my garage yet. And the fact is that I have been told that I had a bad furnace when in reality I didn't and the fact is that they stated to me that by their own tariffs they were -- they told me over the phone, that is meaning Mid-America Energy

by law. They come out here, they don't take a reading. Mid-America says they did. I have two witnesses that will say they didn't. They were standing here the night that the man came out.

The fact is that KPH, when I asked them for a statement they wrote something other than what the serviceman told me a month later. As far as I'm concerned their records are made to lie and look good on paper. Now if you people believe all of this stuff, then I can't stop anybody and I'm not going to try to because it's pointless.

They wrote down on paper something that looked good for the Commission but in actuality if the Commission was doing their job and they're supposed to be there for the people, of which I believe they are, you people would have been looking at the furnace, the phone records from Mid-America Energy from the date that this happened. Because the fact is that I called Mid-America Energy. They were so messed up they couldn't even get their address right on the place who owned the place or anything else until we finally told them.
