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3 1 CHAIRMAN SAHR: I'll call the Commission meeting of Friday, January 27, 2006 to 2 3 order. And the issue before the Commission today is CT05-001. Two items are set for Motion. Todav 4 shall the Commission grant the Motion for Partial 5 Summary Judgment, and shall the Commission grant 6 the Motion in Limine? 7 And, Ms. Rogers, you indicated you had a 8 preliminary matter to bring before the Commission. 9 MS. POLLMAN ROGERS: Yes. Thank 10 11 you, Chairman Sahr. 12 Late vesterday afternoon or vesterday we were advised that the brother-in-law of our expert 13 14 witness, Larry Thompson, passed away. He is out of 15 state. This will take our expert witness, Larry Thompson, to the state of Kansas. I'm not 16 sure if he left today or tomorrow. At any rate, 17 the memorial service is going to be Sunday night. 18 The funeral service is in Wichita, Kansas on 19 Monday, and the internment is going to be in Omaha 20 late Tuesday morning, which means that the soonest 21 that he could get back here, assuming he left 22 immediately after the internment would be late 23 24 Tuesday evening. This would not give us any prep time with our 25

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witness, in addition to which this -- the person that died is leaving Larry's sister as the surviving spouse with three fairly young children.

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I just reluctantly but nevertheless out of deference to my witness and putting someone in that position, I am asking this Commission to continue the hearing date currently set for February 1 through the 3rd. I believe that Larry's priorities in this situation need to be with his family. This is a very tragic time for him, and I understand how hearing dates are certainly at a premium.

Nevertheless, I feel compelled to bring this Motion because I don't believe it's fair to put Mr. Thompson in the situation of having torn loyalties like this. And so I am respectfully requesting the Commission to continue the hearing date currently set for February 1 through the 3rd.

much. And certainly our thoughts go out to Mr. Thompson and his family. It sounds like a very, very difficult situation.

CHAIRMAN SAHR: Well, thank you very

Ms. Rogers, have you had an opportunity to discuss this with any of the other parties? MS. POLLMAN ROGERS: Yes, sir. I have discussed it with Mr. Wieczorek. Obviously

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I've discussed it with my clients. And SDTA has joined in my Motion for a continuance. I've also had consultation with staff counsel, and I did file a written Motion just prior to the hearing so that everyone was aware. I believe I -- in fact, I talked to Mr. Wieczorek immediately after I found out what was happening and indicated my intention to do that, and he can speak for himself as to his response.

CHAIRMAN SAHR: Thank you.

Mr. Wieczorek.

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MR. WIECZOREK: I agree that she told me yesterday afternoon. At that time it was my understanding that she was going to talk to Mr. Thompson in follow up because her concern was him simply getting back Tuesday night. This is a case where we would go first.

I must admit that I haven't had a chance to talk to my client so I can't at this point agree to the continuance because I don't have the authority to do that without conferring with my client first. And it might have been a misinterpretation. As I understood what she told me -- Darla told me yesterday was she was considering it depending on that she needed to talk to Larry again. It doesn't

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6 surprise me that she had to file it to preserve it. 1 But at this point I have not had a chance to confer 2 with my client to say whether I have the authority 3 to agree to a continuance. 4 CHAIRMAN SAHR: Ms. Rogers, I know 5 this has all happened sometime relatively suddenly. 6 Have you had an opportunity to check with our staff 7 to see when the next schedule date that would work 8 9 would be? I have not. MS. POLLMAN ROGERS: 10 And perhaps staff has talked about it without me 11 being there. 12 CHAIRMAN SAHR: All right. 13 Ms. Forney, if you're there, if you could just let 14 us know without necessarily getting into specifics 15 if you don't have them, what are we looking at for 16 possible dates? 17 MS. FORNEY: We might be able to 18 squeeze it in the following week, which would be 19 the 6th through the 10th. The next possible dates 20 after that, and I'm a little nervous to really 21 propose these because it would be the last week of 22 session, which would be the 21st through the 24th 23 of February, and that's also coming off of that 24 three-day President's Day weekend. 25

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1	So it's possible to try to schedule something
2	the week of the 6th through the 10th or as the next
3	alternative probably the 21st through 24th of
4	February.
5	CHAIRMAN SAHR: So it does look like
6	there's some pretty good dates coming up. And, of
7	course, this one is not as long as some of the
8	hearings we have for the allotted time.
9	MS. FORNEY: That's correct.
10	CHAIRMAN SAHR: Any other questions
11	from the Commissioners or comments?
12	VICE CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: No, sir.
13	CHAIRMAN SAHR: Mr. Hanson.
14	COMMISSIONER HANSON: None.
15	CHAIRMAN SAHR: Certainly I think
16	the loss of an important expert witness on a
17	hearing of this magnitude and such a critical
18	witness I think is in my mind and certainly through
19	nothing but completely understandable circumstances
20	it's in my mind certainly enough to grant the
21	request for a continuance.
22	And then, Ms. Rogers, if you'd please work
23	closely with staff, the PUC staff, and
24	Mr. Wieczorek to see if some of these dates in the
25	very near future would work as substantive dates,

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8 we would appreciate that. 1 With that, I would make the Motion that we 2 grant the continuance. 3 VICE CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: Second. 4 COMMISSIONER HANSON: And I concur. 5 MS. POLLMAN ROGERS: Thank you, 6 Mr. Chairman. 7 CHAIRMAN SAHR: You're certainly 8 welcome. Again, on behalf of the Commissioners and 9 Commission, our thoughts go out to Mr. Thompson. 10 The two issues that we have before us now, we 11 have two pending motions, and one of the reasons 12 that we're looking at taking them today and during 13 the ad hoc meeting, of course, was the pendency of 14 the hearing next week and the need to prepare 15 witnesses. 16 I would look to my colleagues and to the 17 Commission staff. We certainly can act on these 18 today. At the same time, we now are no longer 19 under the gun, so to speak, with the pending 20 hearing starting the middle of next week. 21 Any thoughts either from the Commissioners or 22 advisors whether we should rule on these today or 23 wait until perhaps next week? 24 COMMISSIONER HANSON: This is 25

9 Commissioner Hanson. I'm prepared to act on them 1 today. I'm sure you both are as well. 2 From the standpoint of giving the parties an 3 opportunity to perhaps know where we're coming from 4 and in preparation of their materials, it might be 5 good to act today. That's my only comment. 6 7 CHAIRMAN SAHR: Commissioner Johnson. 8 VICE CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: I'm prepared 9 to vote today. I think we probably should. I 10 don't know that I'm 100 percent in my decision, but 11 having read through the case law and everything 12 else four times, I suspect doing it a fifth and 13 sixth time isn't necessarily going to get me any 14 closer than I am to certainty. 15 CHAIRMAN SAHR: Well, with that in 16 mind then the first question is shall the 17 Commission grant the Motion for Partial Summary 18 Judgment. And, Mr. Smith, just to make sure we're 19 all fresh in mind, this is the Western Wireless's 20 Motion for Summary Judgment, and it's the Motion 21 that deals with the language that's talking about 22 the -- I guess focuses at least partially, if not 23 primarily, the mutually agreed upon language? 24 That's right. This is MR. SMITH: 25

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10 the Motion that deals with sections -- with the 1 claims -- portions of the Counterclaim that relate 2 to Section 7.2.3. I was going to try to dig out 3 the precise language here. 4 Well, I'm like Commissioner Johnson. I've 5 6 been pouring over the cases for so long I haven't actually looked at the actual Motion for a while. 7 CHAIRMAN SAHR: I do think we 8 probably are familiar with it enough. I just want 9 to make sure for people that we had it correctly, 10 but do either one of the Commissioners have a 11 12 Motion on this particular issue? 13 VICE CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: 14 Mr. Chairman, I might have a question, if it would be in order, for staff attorney Wiest first. 15 16 CHAIRMAN SAHR: Please proceed. VICE CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: And, you 17 know, her answer may change my mind somewhat, you 18 know, if we would need to delay this decision. I 19 suspect not. But, Ms. Wiest, last week the Supreme 20 Court released Ziegler's Furniture case. 21 MS. AILTS WIEST: Yes. 22 VICE CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: I've read 23 through that. Do you think there's anything in 24 there that changes the landscape of the case -- of 25

11 the Docket before us? 1 MS. AILTS WIEST: You know, I just 2 read through that once so I'm not sure if I can say 3 exactly if it would change it. I mean, I think 4 there are probably some parallels. 5 But, on the other hand, it didn't specifically 6 state that it was relating to an agreement to 7 agree. 8 VICE CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: Mr. Smith, 9 did you have any --10 MR. SMITH: Well, I -- you know, I 11 agree with what Ms. Wiest just said. It doesn't 12 expressly deal with an agreement to agree. Its 13 proximity to this case would strictly be in what --14 it seems to be taking a slightly more liberal 15 attitude than what has been taken previously with 16 respect to contract terms that are not completely 17 fleshed out or a contract that may not have been 18 100 percent fleshed out. 19 In that particular holding, if I'm not 20 mistaken, the court did base its finding or its 21 holding on the fact that all material terms of the 22 contract had been "agreed to" in the term sheet. 23 And then the course of conduct of the parties was 24 such that it reflected -- it was consistent with 25

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12 them having reached agreement in the court's mind. 1 The parallel to this case is that, in fact, 2 the term -- she contemplated the execution of a 3 formal agreement and the parties never did that. 4 So in that sense they never had the agreement that 5 it was contemplated by the term sheet, and yet the 6 court held that it was enforceable. 7 VICE CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: Okay. Thank 8 -you, Mr. Smith. 9 CHAIRMAN SAHR: All right. 10 Mr. Johnson, I don't want to put you on the spot. 11 I have a feeling you may be the swing vote in this 12 13 one. Do you want to make a Motion, or do you want 14 15 me? VICE CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: 16 Mr. Chairman, I would make the Motion to deny the 17 Motion for Summary Judgment. 18 COMMISSIONER HANSON: This is 19 Hanson. I second that Motion. 20 CHAIRMAN SAHR: And I dissent on 21 that Motion. And I should say a couple of concerns 22 that I have is, one, I do think the contract law 23 issues in the State of South Dakota are fairly well 24 settled on this matter. And in different context 25

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cases over types of contractual relationships might lead to a different answer, but in my mind it is something that is well settled in South Dakota Law and the reason that I reached an independent basis was very similar to what staff attorney Rolayne Wiest recommended as well at the last hearing.

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And I also think you could rule in favor of granting the Motion for Partial Summary Judgment and it might be possible then for the Commission to still come back and interpret that provision and give it meaning and make the determination on the traffic study as part of the hearing as well.

Then the second Motion is shall the Commission grant the Motion in Limine? Mr. Smith, do you want to just give a two-sentence --

MR. SMITH: The Motion in Limine is to restrict the admission of Parole Evidence related to clause -- just a minute -- Section 2.1 of the Interconnection Agreement on the grounds that there is no basis for -- under South Dakota Law for the admission of Parole Evidence. There's no ambiguity nor any of the other grounds met here. CHAIRMAN SAHR: Thank you. And I will move that the Commission grant the Motion in

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14 Limine. 1 VICE CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: I would 2 second the Motion. 3 COMMISSIONER HANSON: And I concur. 4 CHAIRMAN SAHR: Thank you. Is there 5 anything else to come before the Commission on this 6 7 matter? Hearing none, Ms. Rogers, Mr. Wieczorek, 8 excuse me -- Mr. Wieczorek, if you would please 9 work with staff and look at the dates where we 10 could get this hearing scheduled, I would 11 appreciate that. 12 That will conclude the Ad Hoc Commission 13 meeting hearing of Friday, January 27.
