ORDER DISMISSING COMPLAINT AND CLOSING DOCKET

On April 20, 2000, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a complaint filed by Wheeler and Gloria Gill, Townhouse Bakery, Canton, South Dakota (Complainant), against Long Distance Services, CEO Telecommunications, Inc., Business Options, Inc. and Home Owners Long Distance, Inc. The Complainants allege that their long distance service was switched without their authorization and that there was unauthorized billing for those services. The Complainants requested the imposition of statutory remedies.

On June 13, 2000, the Commission Staff received a letter from Complainant indicating that there had been a resolution of the matter and that the case should be considered closed.

The Commission finds that it has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapters 1-26, 49-13, and 49-31.

On June 20, 2000, at a regularly scheduled meeting, the Commission considered this matter. Upon recommendation of Commission Staff, the Commission voted to dismiss the complaint and close the docket. It is therefore

ORDERED, that the complaint shall be dismissed and the docket closed.
