On May 8, 1996, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a filing from Turner-Hutchinson Electric Cooperative, Inc. of Marion, South Dakota (Turner-Hutchinson) for approval of an agreement for service rights exception. The purpose of the filing was to seek Commission approval for Turner-Hutchinson to provide service to its outpost office and pole yard facility located in territory currently serviced by Northwestern Public Service Company. Turner-Hutchinson submitted a letter of justification, a map and plat of the affected area, a copy of a "Consent and Agreement," and a copy of a warranty deed showing the transfer of the subject property to Turner-Hutchinson. The property which is the subject of this transfer and request for approval is described as:

Adkins Tract 1 in the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (NW1/4 NW1/4) of Section Nineteen (19), Township Ninety-nine (99) North, Range Sixty (60), West of the 5th P.M., Hutchinson County, South Dakota.

The Commission finds that it has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL 49-34A, specifically, 49-34A-4, 49-34A-42, and 49-34A-55. Further, the Commission finds that the service rights transfer is in the public interest and the request shall be granted. As the Commission's final decision in this matter, it is therefore

**ORDERED** that the request seeking approval of service rights transfer is hereby granted.
