On January 14, 2003, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received an application for a certificate of authority from Alticomm, Inc. (Alticomm).

Alticomm proposes to provide a full range of services on a resale basis. A proposed tariff was filed by Alticomm.

On January 16, 2003, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of January 31, 2003, to interested individuals and entities. No petitions to intervene or comments were filed and at its regularly scheduled February 20, 2003, meeting, the Commission considered Alticomm's request for a certificate of authority. Commission Staff recommended granting a certificate of authority, subject to rural safeguards, and subject to the condition that Alticomm not offer a prepaid calling card or require or accept deposits or advance payments without prior approval of the Commission.

The Commission finds that it has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapter 49-31, specifically 49-31-3 and 49-31-69 and ARSD 20:10:24:02, 20:10:24:03 and 20:10:32:03. The Commission finds that Alticomm has met the legal requirements established for the granting of a certificate of authority. Alticomm has, in accordance with SDCL 49-31-3 and 49-31-71, demonstrated sufficient technical, financial and managerial capabilities to offer telecommunications services in South Dakota.

The Commission approves Alticomm's application for a certificate of authority, subject to rural safeguards, and subject to the condition that Alticomm not offer a prepaid calling card or require or accept deposits or advance payments without prior approval of the Commission. The certificate of authority for Alticomm shall authorize it to offer local exchange services in South Dakota, except in those areas served by a rural telephone company. In the future, should Alticomm choose to provide local exchange services statewide, with respect to rural telephone companies, Alticomm will have to come before the Commission in another proceeding before being able to provide local service in that rural service area pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 253(f) which allows the Commission to require a company that seeks to provide service in a rural service area to meet the requirements in 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(1) for designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier. In addition, the granting of statewide certification will not affect the exemptions, suspensions, and modifications for rural telephone companies found in 47 U.S.C. § 251(f). It is therefore

ORDERED, that Alticomm's application for a certificate of authority to provide interexchange telecommunications services and local exchange services is granted, effective March 14, 2003, subject to the condition that Alticomm not offer a prepaid calling card or require or accept deposits or advance payments without prior approval of the Commission; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that Alticomm shall file informational copies of tariff changes with the Commission as the changes occur; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that the Commission shall authorize Alticomm to offer its local exchange services in South Dakota, except in those areas served by a rural telephone company.
