**ORDER GRANTING
CERTIFICATE OF
AUTHORITY**

On April 24, 2018, the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a filing from Time Clock Solutions, LLC (Time Clock) for a certificate of authority to provide local exchange and interexchange long distance services in South Dakota. Time Clock intends to provide competitive local exchange services in the non-rural areas of CenturyLink's areas and interchange service on a statewide basis.

On April 26, 2018, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of May 11, 2018, to interested individuals and entities on the Commission's PUC Weekly Filing electronic listserv. No petitions to intervene or comments were filed. On May 7, 2017, Time Clock filed a Certificate of Service showing other competitive local exchange carriers in South Dakota were served with the application for a certificate of authority. On May 11, 2017, Time Clock responded to Commission staff's data request.

At its regularly scheduled meeting on June 12, 2018, the Commission considered this matter. Commission staff recommended granting a certificate of authority with the conditions that, for retail purposes, Time Clock not offer any prepaid services including prepaid calling cards and not accept or require any deposits or advance payments without prior approval of the Commission, and subject to rural safeguards.

The Commission finds that it has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapter 49-31, specifically 49-31-3 and 49-31-69 through 49-31-75, and ARSD 20:10:24:02 and 20:10:32:03. The Commission finds that Time Clock has met the legal requirements established for the granting of a certificate of authority. Time Clock has, in accordance with SDCL 49-31-3 and 49-31-71, demonstrated sufficient technical, financial, and managerial capabilities to offer telecommunications services in South Dakota.

The Commission voted unanimously to approve Time Clock's application for a certificate of authority subject to the conditions that, for retail purposes, Time Clock not offer any prepaid services including prepaid calling cards and not accept or require any deposits or advance payments without prior approval of the Commission, and be subject to rural safeguards. The certificate of authority for Time Clock shall authorize it to provide local exchange telecommunications service in South Dakota, except in those areas served by a rural telephone company. In the future, should Time Clock choose to provide local exchange services statewide, with respect to rural telephone companies, Time Clock will have to come before the Commission in another proceeding before being able to provide local service in that rural service area pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 253(f) which allows the Commission to require a company that seeks to provide service in a rural service area to meet the requirements in 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(1) for designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier. In addition, the granting of statewide certification will not affect the exemptions, suspensions, and modifications for rural telephone companies found in 47 U.S.C. § 251(f). It is therefore

ORDERED, that Time Clock's application for a certificate of authority to provide interexchange services in South Dakota is granted. It is further

ORDERED, that Time Clock's request for a certificate of authority to provide local exchange services is granted, subject to the conditions that, for retail purposes, Time Clock not offer any prepaid services including prepaid calling cards and not accept or require any deposits or advance payments without prior approval of the Commission, and subject to rural safeguards. It is further

ORDERED, that this certificate of authority authorizes Time Clock to offer its local exchange services in South Dakota, except in those areas served by a rural telephone company. It is further

ORDERED, that this order constitutes Time Clock's Certificate of Authority as described above.
