

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# **ABOUT THE PUC**

South Dakotans elect their three Public Utilities Commissioners to staggered, six-year terms. A dedicated staff of analysts, attorneys, consumer representatives, and other professionals work with the commissioners to carry out the duties of the PUC. The PUC's website, www.puc.sd.gov, contains a wealth of information including audio webcasts and recordings of meetings and hearings.



The commission regulates investor-owned electric, natural gas, and telephone utilities. The PUC ensures utility companies in South Dakota provide safe and reliable service and that investor-owned companies do so with just, reasonable rates. It plays a more limited regulatory role with respect to telecommunications companies and cooperative, independent and municipal utilities.



The PUC has authority to issue permits for the construction of energy conversion, AC/DC conversion, wind energy, solar energy and electric transmission facilities, as well as certain pipelines, including those designed to transport coal, gas, liquid hydrocarbon products or carbon dioxide.



The commission advocates for smart energy and telecommunications policy at state and federal levels and works hard to educate consumers about ways to save energy and money.



The PUC helps resolve disputes between customers and their utilities and operates the South Dakota Do Not Call registry. The commission also administers the natural gas pipeline safety program and licenses and inspects grain warehouses and grain buyers.

## PUC INFORMATION ONLINE

In addition to regulatory information, the PUC website carries content specifically designed to inform and assist consumers.

Don't Know? Don't Answer! Right from the PUC's homepage, folks can access a plethora of tips and hints about how to avoid falling victim to a phone scam. The best defense? If you don't know the number that's calling you, don't answer the phone! Check it out at puc.sd.gov/scamcalls.

Life. Uninterrupted. The site, SDDoNotCall.com, dispenses advice about how consumers can add their personal phone numbers to the national Do Not Call Registry to reduce the amount of telemarketing calls they receive. The site also describes how telemarketing companies doing business in South Dakota need to comply with applicable statutes and rules.

# CHAIRMAN GARY HANSON

### **ELECTIONS & APPOINTMENTS**

Gary was first elected to the PUC in 2002. South Dakota voters re-elected Gary to continue serving on the PUC in 2008, 2014 and 2020.

### **COMMISSION LEADERSHIP**

Gary served as the commission's chairman in 2005, 2008, 2011, 2013, 2014, 2019 and 2020 and as vice chairman in 2003, 2004, 2011, 2017 and 2018.

### **EXPERIENCE**

Gary was twice elected mayor of Sioux Falls and oversaw multiple departmental operations. Prior to serving as mayor, Gary was Sioux Falls' utilities commissioner for six years and was responsible for the day-to-day

activities for three municipal utilities. He owned several businesses before being elected to office. Gary served three terms in the South Dakota Senate, was chair of the committees on Bonding and of Government Audit and Operations, and was vice chair of the Taxation Committee.

Gary co-founded the \$650 million Lewis and Clark Regional Water System. He was also instrumental in the founding of the Multicultural Center, transformation and revitalization of Falls Park, Community Drug Concerns Task Force, Great Plains Waicipi, and endowments for the Sioux Falls Pavillion and Great Plains Zoo. While Gary was mayor of Sioux Falls, the violent crime rate was decreased every year except one for a total decrease of over 31 percent.

Awards and honors received by Gary include: Distinguished Alumnus of Northern State University, Sioux Falls' City Father of the Year, YMCA Tri-State Hall of Fame, International Lions Club Melvin Jones Fellow, Outstanding Young Citizen of South Dakota, Habitat for Humanity's Hat's Off Award, Spirit of Downtown Sioux Falls Award, White Cane Safety Award, Multiple Sclerosis Society Chapter's Mayor of the Year, Children's Care Hospital Wings of Love Award, DAV's Outstanding Legislator Award, and Life Member of Lions Club Sight and Service Foundation.

# VICE CHAIRMAN CHRIS NELSON

## **ELECTIONS & APPOINTMENTS**

Chris was appointed to the commission by Gov. Dennis Daugaard on Jan. 8, 2011, to fill a vacancy. In November 2012, South Dakota voters elected Chris to continue his service for the remaining four years of the term to which he was appointed. He was re-elected to a full term in November 2016.

### **COMMISSION LEADERSHIP**

Chris served as the PUC's chairman in 2012, 2015 and 2016 and as vice chairman in 2011, 2013, 2014, 2019 and 2020.

### EXPERIENCE

Prior to joining the PUC, Chris was elected South Dakota's secretary of state in the 2002 general election. He was unopposed for re-election in 2006, which was the first time the office was unopposed in the history of South Dakota.

Before serving as secretary of state, Chris held the position of state election supervisor in the secretary of state's office for 13 years and was uniform commercial code supervisor in the same office for two years.

This annual award is given as recognition for the most outstanding election administration professional practice in the nation. The award recognizes the 2008 development and implementation of a new central election reporting system for the state.

Kristie was appointed to the commission on Aug. 9, 2011, by Gov. Dennis Daugaard, to fill a vacancy. She was elected to her first, full six-year term in November 2012 and re-elected in November 2018.

# ABOUT OUR PUC STAFF

The PUC's staff members perform a variety of duties on behalf of the citizens of South Dakota in support of the commission

As **executive director**, **Patricia Van Gerpen** is responsible for the overall management of the PUC staff and day-to-day operations of the agency. She makes docket and project assignments and is the liaison between the commissioners and staff on all issues. Patricia also works directly on a number of legislative, strategic planning and policy initiatives.

**Leah Mohr, deputy executive director**, schedules hearings and various meetings for the commission. She oversees the PUC's websites, outreach materials and news releases, handles media inquiries and coordinates logistics for informational and educational meetings. She supervises the commission's administrative support staff and functions.

**Cindy Kemnitz, finance manager**, is responsible for the commission's fiscal activities including administrative functions related to the gross receipts tax, the regulatory assessment fee fund and the telephone solicitor registry. She prepares and monitors budgets and handles accounting, payroll and purchasing duties. She also prepares the commission's meeting agendas.

**Brittany Olson** serves as the **communications specialist**. She is responsible for the development of educational materials and news releases, and assists with meeting and event coordination, and website management.

Advising the commissioners are **Karen Cremer** and **Adam de Hueck** as **commission attorneys** and **Greg Rislov** as **commission advisor**. The attorneys also serve as hearing examiners and represent the commission in federal courts and before federal regulatory agencies. Greg provides policy and technical consultation and research support regarding major regulatory issues.

Administrative staff members perform a variety of support services including handling incoming phone calls and mail and greeting guests. Each staff member has specific duties that keep the PUC running smoothly. Joy Lashley has primary responsibility for maintaining the PUC electronic docket system as well as each of the websites the commission operates. Kaitlyn Baucom schedules and coordinates meeting logistics, travel and training. Macy Jo Murren assists with the preparation of orders, handles meeting minutes, and distributes meeting agendas and weekly filings.

**Staff analysts** are responsible for investigating, analyzing, evaluating and presenting testimony regarding issues and policies related to electric, natural gas and telecommunications industries as regulated by the commission. Their educational and professional backgrounds include expertise in math, accounting, economics, and research as well as intensive training in regulatory issues. **Brittany Mehlhaff, Eric Paulson, Joseph Rezac**, and **Patrick Steffensen** use these skills to focus on quality of service, financial and rate matters as they work to understand and evaluate complex rate structures, earning requirements, and technical issues of various utility organizations. **Darren Kearney** and **Jon Thurber** primarily concentrate on siting dockets, emerging technologies, and energy efficiency efforts. They also engage in outreach activities to consumers, industry representatives and students, and provide other docket analysis as assigned. **Kristen Edwards** and **Amanda Reiss** are **staff attorneys** with practical experience in administrative law, trial procedure, and business management principles. They review filings by utilities and represent the staff in proceedings before the commission. They work closely with staff analysts to develop recommendations for policy, rate, siting and enforcement matters. They coordinate the presentation of the staff's case and cross-examine other parties who submit testimony.

The **Pipeline Safety Program** is staffed by engineers **Mary Zanter** and **Boice Hillmer** with Mary handling additional duties as program manager. The PUC administers the program on behalf of the U.S. Department of Transportation's Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration. Mary and Boice inspect and investigate intrastate natural gas pipelines to ensure the public is provided safe and dependable gas service. They also analyze utility dockets as assigned.

**Cody Chambliss** is the manager of the **Grain Warehouse Program** that works to protect property of and safeguard payments to grain producers. **Justin Blais, Paul Kenefick-Aschoff** and **Sarah McIntosh** conduct grain warehouse and grain buyer inspections and investigations, and review financial documents. Paul also assists with issuance of warehouse and grain buyer licenses. The warehouse staff also performs check-off audits for various grain commissions and councils.

The **Consumer Affairs Program** works with consumers to answer questions and resolve complaints about the rates and services of regulated utilities. Manager **Deb Gregg** and representatives **Vicky Burns** and **Jason Schuchard** act as liaisons between consumers and utility companies in resolving these issues. This program's staff also coordinates the PUC's presence at home shows and the State Fair and makes group presentations as requested.

# **WORKING THROUGH COVID-19**

Like other government agencies, the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission was indeed impacted by the coronavirus in 2020. Commissioners and staff worked from home at times. Safety protocols were put in place. Grain warehouse and pipeline safety inspections were conducted remotely. Commission meetings took place over the phone. Virtual conferences kept us connected.

Generally, it was business as usual, under unusual circumstances. Specifically, adaptations were made to ensure the commission remained accessible while meeting its obligations and keeping commissioners and staff as safe as possible.

- Staff were present in the PUC's Capitol office every workday in 2020. The ratio of commissioners and staff working in the Capitol and remotely fluctuated depending on the rate of coronavirus infections reported in Hughes County.
- Regular commission meetings were held on schedule. Meetings in March, April and May were held completely telephonically. Thereafter, commission meetings were held in the Capitol with many participants joining by telephone, much like before the pandemic.
- The PUC followed the CDC's guidance regarding group gatherings and transitioned traditional in-person public input meetings to telephonic sessions.
- Clear barriers were added to some workstations to provide additional protection from the airborne virus. Bottles of hand sanitizer and cleaning spray became office décor.
- Dependence on technology was stepped up to a new level. MS Teams, Zoom and Webex became familiar tools.
- Throughout the pandemic, the PUC continued to function as a commission that was open, working and accessible to the public.

# 2020 YEAR IN REVIEW

A look back highlighting actions taken by the PUC during the 2020 calendar year.

# **ELECTRIC & NATURAL GAS**

The South Dakota Public Utilities Commission looks after the interests of South Dakotans as related to electric and natural gas issues. Actions taken and decisions made by the commission strive to ensure reliable service and reasonable rates from investor-owned utilities as well as fair service territory boundaries for all utilities. The commission follows guidelines prescribed by South Dakota law when siting energy conversion and electric transmission facilities. The components of this priority affect South Dakotans in terms of reliability and cost of their electric and natural gas services.

The PUC uses several measures to gauge the agency's effectiveness at handling these issues. Here is a look at the PUC's electric and natural gas work in 2020.

# ELECTRIC AND NATURAL GAS RATE CHANGES AND ADJUSTMENTS

Reviewing electric and natural gas rates from around the state, region and nation offers perspective to evaluate the financial impact of South Dakota ratepayers' experience compared to residents in other states.

In April, the commission approved an annual update to **Montana-Dakota Utilities Co.**'s infrastructure rider rate. The update approved a 2020 Infrastructure Rider revenue requirement of \$1,251,107, authorized the inclusion of the Sidney Transmission Line Project and Mandan Substation Project, and approved MDU's request to increase the tariff rate to \$0.00841 per kWh. As a result, a residential customer using 853 kWh saw \$0.57 added to their monthly bill.

The commission approved an update to **Xcel Energy**'s infrastructure rider factor in December. The change adds approximately \$2.27 to an average residential customer's monthly bill and allows Xcel Energy to recover the cost of 70 previously approved projects and four new projects.

## ELECTRIC AND NATURAL GAS RATE CHANGES AND ADJUSTMENTS CONTINUED...

PUC staff continued processing Xcel Energy's proxy pricing proposal to adjust certain fuel clause rider (FCR) power purchase costs which was filed in January 2018 as a result of the investigation that began in late 2016. Staff was tasked with evaluating whether the recovery of certain power purchase agreements (PPAs) through the company's FCR were reasonable and cost effective for South Dakota customers and engaged with the company in numerous negotiation sessions. The settlement approved by the commission in September 2017 adjusted the costs of certain challenged resources to reflect a fair and reasonable price for electricity for South Dakota consumers, including a proxy price for the Aurora Solar PPA and a capacity proxy price for the 187 MW Solar PPAs. The settlement deferred the decision on certain other resources to a separate proceeding, which resulted in Xcel's 2018 filing. Parties again engaged in settlement discussions and ultimately agreed to a comprehensive resolution on all issues and filed a settlement agreement with the commission in February 2020. The settlement established an energy proxy price for 187 MW Solar PPAs, an index proxy price for appropriate C-BED PPAs, a capacity and energy proxy price for all RDF resources, including four solar PPAs, two wind PPAs, and one biomass PPA, and an over \$3.2 million refund for South Dakota customers. The commission accepted the joint settlement agreement in March and further found that interest should be applied to the amount to be refunded to customers and ordered Xcel to apply an interest rate consistent with the carrying charge rate used in the FCR of 7.22%. The total amount credited to South Dakota customers through the FCR in April, May and June, including interest, was over \$3.9 million.

The commission processed several transmission cost recovery tariff requests with these results:

- In February, **Otter Tail Power Co.**'s updated TCR rider rate was approved by the commission. The updated rate allows for the recovery of more than \$2.3 million related to two previously approved transmission projects, a transmission adjustment from rate case EL18-021, Southwest Power Pool Schedule 9 and Schedule 11 expenses, Midcontinent Independent System Operator Schedule 26 and 26A expenses and revenues and MISO Schedule 9 and MVP ARR revenues. As a result of this change, the average residential bill decreased by approximately \$0.02 per month.
- In March, an updated TCR rider rate for **MidAmerican Energy Co.** was approved. The updated rate covers allowed costs related to the MISO's Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Transmission Rate Schedules 10, 10-FERC, 26, and 26-A. The \$413,459 approved revenue requirement translates roughly to a \$0.39 monthly bill increase for a typical residential customer's bill averaging 700 kWh per month.
- In April, Montana-Dakota Utilities Co.'s updated TCR rider rate was approved by the commission. The updated rate reflects the 2020 recovery period that includes the Ellendale to Leola Transmission and Dickinson Loop Line projects, transmission service costs for the MISO and Southwest Power Pool and revenue from the use of company facilities in MISO and SPP markets. The \$764,144 approved revenue requirement translates roughly to a \$0.02 monthly bill decrease for a typical residential customer's bill averaging 853 kWh per month.
- In December, the commission approved Xcel Energy's request for an update to its TCR rate to allow recovery of over \$7.2 million related to 24 transmission projects and costs associated with MISO's Schedule 26 expenses. An average residential customer using 750 kWh per month saw a monthly increase on their bill of approximately \$0.31.

### ELECTRIC AND NATURAL GAS RATE CHANGES AND ADJUSTMENTS CONTINUED...

In August, the PUC approved an update to **Otter Tail Power Co.**'s phase-in rider rate with a revised "percent-of-bill" phase-in rider factor of 6.521% and a revenue requirement of \$1,624,525. The updated rate allows Otter Tail to recover costs associated with the Merricourt Wind and Astoria Station projects and provides customers with offsetting revenue credits for new load growth in the Lake Norden area and net savings associated with the Hoot Lake Plant retirement. As a result, a typical residential customer using 1,000 kWh per month will see a monthly bill increase of \$2.30.

Vice Chairman Chris Nelson, along with a panel of PUC staff experts, led a virtual presentation about pricing and eligibility changes to PURPA for an EUCI audience. The group provided a commission perspective on the new ruling, specifically how ratepayers are considered and protected throughout the process. Staff members sharing their experience included Greg Rislov, commission advisor; Kristen Edwards, staff attorney; and Darren Kearney, staff analyst.

### COMPLAINTS

In August, the commission approved a settlement stipulation from **Energy of Utah**, **LLC and Fall River Solar**, **LLC**, **Black Hills Energy** and PUC staff resolving all issues stemming from the complaint filed in 2018 by Fall River against Black Hills Energy. The complaint was in relation to a proposed 80megawatt solar facility in Fall River County and the determination of avoided cost in accordance with the Public Utilities Regulatory Policies Act of 1978. The settlement's key provisions include a PPA rate, established that Renewable Energy Credits would be transferred to Black Hills Energy at no additional cost for the benefit of their customers, identified basic terms of the PPA like length and commercial operation date estimates and stated that Fall River and Black Hills will enter into a Large Generator Interconnection Agreement. Several stipulations for continuances were filed with the commission in 2020 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

### **ELECTRIC RELIABILITY**

The electric utility industry uses indices to track and benchmark performance reliability. Companies use this data to evaluate and improve upon their response to outages, handling of customer complaints and system integrity. Though electric utilities in South Dakota are not required to report these scores to the PUC, the companies discuss the information with the commission and a comparison to national scores is ascertained.

### INDICES

**System Average Interruption Duration Index** (SAIDI): The average amount of time a customer's service is interrupted during the reporting period

**System Average Interruption Frequency Index** (SAIFI): The average number of interruptions that a customer would experience

**Customer Average Interruption Duration Index** (CAIDI): The average outage duration that any given customer would experience. CAIDI can also be viewed as the average restoration time.

### *Measurement* South Dakota 2020 scores compared to National 2019 median score

Sixteen of the 18 scores provided to the PUC by South Dakota's six investorowned utilities were better than the median. Analyzing the scores with relation to customer base and other factors reveals that the utilities have a high degree of electric reliability performance.

### SITING

In November, the commission approved a permit, with 38 conditions, for the construction of the **Wild Springs Solar Project**. The commission had approved a settlement agreement, presented by Wild Springs Solar, LLC, PUC staff and the Bundorf Family Trust, the docket's only intervenor, earlier that month addressing all issues except for decommissioning financial assurance. The 128-megawatt solar energy facility will include approximately 340,000 solar panels and will span up to 1,499 acres of privately-owned land in Pennington County. The company filed its application with the commission in May and a public input meeting was held telephonically in July.

A permit to construct the **Crowned Ridge Wind II** project, a 301-megawatt wind energy facility to be built in Codington, Deuel and Grant counties, was granted by the PUC in March of 2020. The project includes up to 132 wind turbines and associated facilities spread across a 60,996-acre project area east of Watertown. Xcel Energy purchased the first phase of the project which consists of 200 MWs. The second phase may consist of 100 MWs and is currently on hold due to a lack of transmission capacity. Crowned Ridge submitted their application to the PUC in July of 2019 and the commission held a public input meeting in Watertown in August 2019. Intervention was granted to several individuals and a three-day evidentiary hearing was held by the commission in Pierre in February 2020. Between April 29 and May 5, 2020, three filings were made to appeal the commission's decision to the South Dakota 3rd Circuit Court. In mid-May, all three appeals from intervenors Amber Christenson, Allen Robish, Garry Ehlebracht, Steven Greber, Mary Greber, Richard Rall, Amy Rall and Laretta Kranz were consolidated into one docket. A decision on this appeal is expected in 2021.

In February, the commission approved their first large scale solar project and issued a permit to construct **Lookout Solar Project** in Oglala Lakota County. The project will span 810 acres on the Pine Ridge Reservation, will be capable of generating up to 110 megawatts of electricity and is expected to include up to 500,000 solar panels. Lookout Solar filed its application with the PUC on Dec. 17, 2018. A public input hearing was held in Hermosa in February of 2019.

In April, the **South Dakota 3rd Circuit Court** issued an order affirming the commission's decision to grant a permit to construct the Crowned Ridge Wind Farm, an up to 300-megawatt wind energy facility in Grant and Codington counties. The PUC's decision had been appealed by intervenors Amber Christenson, Allen Robish, Kristi Mogen, Patrick Lynch and Melissa Lynch. On May 22, 2020, Amber Christenson and Allen Robish appealed the circuit court's decision to the South Dakota Supreme Court. A decision by that court is expected in 2021. The project began construction in 2019 and became operational in December of 2019.

In June, the **South Dakota Supreme Court** upheld the commission's 2019 decision to grant a permit to construct the Crowned Ridge Wind Farm. Timothy and Linda Lindgren sought the appeal before the high court after the 3rd Circuit Court dismissed the Lindgren appeal in December of 2019.

The PUC received an application for a facility permit from Meridian Wind Project LLC to construct an up to 175-megawatt wind energy conversion facility, an 8.9-mile, 345-kV transmission line and associated facilities in Hyde County. A public input hearing was held telephonically in June and one intervenor, Nicolas Ferens, was granted party status. (In January 2021, the applicant filed a motion to withdraw the application due to substantial and unexpected interconnection costs. The commission granted the motion at their Jan. 19, 2021, meeting.)

### **ENERGY EFFICIENCY**

The commission approved updates to energy efficiency and conservation programs. In 2020, the estimated energy savings for all investor-owned utilities was 27,582 megawatt hours of electricity and 8,144 dekatherms of natural gas.

- Xcel Energy's 2021 DSM Plan was approved by the commission as well as the 2019 DSM status report, 2019 financial incentive, 2019 DSM Tracker Account, and the revised 2021 DSM Cost Adjustment Factor. The 2021 Demand Side Management plan included adjustments to LED-related rebates for residential and business lighting programs.
- Black Hills Energy eliminated its Energy Efficiency Solutions plan after determining it was no longer cost effective to continue.
- Otter Tail Power Co. continued its Energy Efficiency Plan in 2020. The commission approved the 2019 financial incentive, 2019 Energy Efficiency Plan Status Report and the revised Energy Efficiency Adjustment Factor. Otter Tail modified certain existing programs and plans to expand its offerings beginning in 2021 with additional incentives including home LED lighting, smart thermostats and appliance recycling for residential customers and direct install incentives for commercial customers.

### COVID-19

In March, S.D. Gov. Kristi Noem declared a state of emergency in response to the coronavirus pandemic. President Trump declared the COVID-19 pandemic a national emergency. Neither the governor nor the commission ordered a moratorium on utility disconnections. However, in the weeks following the emergency declarations, South Dakota investor-owned utilities, at various start times, all placed moratoriums on disconnections and late payment fees during the pandemic for an indefinite amount of time. In May, the commission received a joint request to defer treatment of the financial effects of COVID-19 and the creation of regulatory assets from Xcel Energy, MidAmerican Energy Co., NorthWestern Energy, Otter Tail Power Co. and Montana-Dakota Utilities Co. In August, the commission granted the joint request for deferred accounting treatment and creation of regulatory assets, subject to certain conditions recommended by PUC staff. The companies continue to provide quarterly updates regarding costs incurred as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic in accordance with those conditions.

# **TELECOMMUNICATIONS**

The commission has varied regulatory authority over telecommunications providers and services in South Dakota. The PUC issues certificates of authority to certain providers; approves switched access rates for local exchange carriers; designates providers as eligible telecommunications carriers and certifies carriers as eligible to receive federal high-cost support; approves interconnection agreements between providers; and arbitrates disputes between providers. In addition, the commission serves as a resource on emerging issues.

The PUC uses several measures to gauge the agency's effectiveness at handling these issues. Here is a look at the commission's telecommunications work in 2020.

## **BROADBAND DEPLOYMENT**

While the commission does not have a statutory duty related to broadband service, it recognizes the importance of broadband availability to South Dakotans and advocates for the expansion of advanced telecommunications services. The Federal Communications Commission tracks broadband deployment through an Annual Broadband Progress Report. The report describes telecommunications deployment according to census blocks. The information is updated annually to reflect changes in population and the construction of new homes. The PUC uses this information to track broadband expansion in the state.

Measurement, for reporting year ending June 30, 2020 New census blocks that meet 10 mbps download speed: 3,082 New census blocks that meet 25 mbps download speed: 10,023

# UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUND

Twenty-eight telecommunications carriers were deemed eligible to collectively receive millions of dollars in high cost support from the federal Universal Service Fund for maintaining, upgrading and building out their voice and broadband networks in South Dakota. Each year, the commission must certify to the Federal Communications Commission that these carriers, designated as Eligible Telecommunications Carriers (ETCs), are using funds for the provision, maintenance and upgrading of facilities and services for which the support is intended. Dollars invested reflect the strengthening and expansion of telecommunications infrastructure, to enhance system reliability and enable more service options to more customers, particularly in rural areas. In 2019, the Universal Service Administrative Co. distributed nearly \$134 million in High Cost Support and over \$1.7 million in Lifeline and Link-Up monies to South Dakota companies.

### WIRELESS

Monitored the actions and results as new wireless telecommunications sites were launched by companies at a number of locations including those in or near Aberdeen, Belle Fourche, Box Elder, Conde, Custer, Dakota Dunes, Edgemont, Ellsworth AFB, Hayes, Long Lake, Martin, McIntosh, New Underwood, Philip, Rapid City, Shadehill, Sioux Falls, Watertown, Webster, Wewela, Witten and Woonsocket.

### **PUBLIC ADVOCACY**

**Vice Chairman Chris Nelson** joined a bipartisan group of state officials at a virtual news conference to raise concerns about proposed FCC rule changes to the Lifeline program that would add new program mandates which would reduce marketplace options.

# PIPELINE SAFETY

The PUC has responsibility to regulate natural gas intrastate pipelines, which includes ensuring the public is provided safe and dependable gas service. As part of its duties, commission staff inspects and investigates natural gas pipeline operators for compliance with federal and state statutes and administrative rules. Here is a look at the commission's pipeline safety work in 2020.

### INSPECTIONS

PUC pipeline safety inspectors regularly inspect natural gas pipeline operators to determine compliance with state and federal regulations. Inspections occur in the areas of records, construction, drug and alcohol, public awareness, incident investigation, operator qualification, and integrity management. The number of inspection hours logged by the safety inspectors is an indicator of the agency's thoroughness in this area. The PUC's certification agreement to administer this program for the U.S. Department of Transportation's Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration specifies that a minimum of 127 inspection days are required annually.

Measurement, 2020 Inspections: 176.75 days (127 days required)

## FEDERAL AUDIT

South Dakota's pipeline safety program is field audited annually by PHMSA's Office of Pipeline Safety (Central Region). The agency reviews inspections conducted and citations issued by the PUC and evaluates the commission's adherence to its pipeline safety procedures plan. The result of the federal review indicates the PUC's ability to carry out its obligations related to pipeline safety. PHMSA also reviews and scores South Dakota's annual certification document submittals.

Measurement, 2020 Audit score: 100%

## FEDERAL CERTIFICATION

PUC staff members involved in pipeline safety inspection are required to complete seven training courses to become certified pipeline safety inspectors. Additional training is required for certification to conduct specialty inspections for control room management, distribution integrity management programs, public awareness, and transmission integrity management. The courses are taught by the federal Pipeline Safety Office of Training and Qualifications and are designed to educate federal and state pipeline safety inspectors in the application of compliance requirements, inspection techniques and enforcement procedures.

### Measurement, 2020

PUC inspectors are fully certified to conduct all inspections.

## PIPELINE SAFETY OPERATOR TRAINING CONFERENCE

The PUC hosted the annual **South Dakota/North Dakota Pipeline Safety Operator Training** for more than 130 members of the pipeline safety industry from both states. Unable to host an in-person event in the spring as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the conference was transitioned to a distance event held in October. Participants virtually attended presentations by experts discussing excavation damage prevention, electrofusion failures, safety culture, flooding impact on gas systems and more. The event also included an exhibitor showcase with 14 companies participating.

# **DAMAGE PREVENTION DIGITAL CAMPAIGN & WORKSHOP**

Beginning in May, the commission's pipeline safety program began a damage prevent campaign to remind homeowners, farmers, excavators and contractors to utilize 811's call before you dig service. Tactics included online search marketing efforts and social media and web-based advertisement placement on Facebook and Google. Overall, the campaign, which concluded in September, performed well, exceeding overall campaign goals across all tactics. Funding for the promotion was provided through a State Damage Prevention Grant awarded to the PUC from the PHMSA.

The State Damage Prevention Grant also funded a half-day workshop for locators and excavators. The workshop focused on lessons learned from recent events, the availability and utilization of new resources like the Safe Excavator App and the role of innovative tools and technology in preventing damage to underground utilities. The event also featured two panels with contractors, locators, underground facility operators and other stakeholders discussing some of the more controversial issues facing them and what can be done to advance safety in the future. The workshop, originally scheduled to be two separate in-person workshops for locators and excavators in April, was rescheduled and converted to a virtual event due to the coronavirus pandemic. The online event was held in November with 94 industry professionals participating.

# LEGISLATION

Occasionally, the commission finds that current South Dakota laws are in need of modification or clarification and makes efforts to update legislation. In addition to legislative efforts, the commission and staff take an active role in the annual budgeting process.

# APPROPRIATIONS

**Chairman Gary Hanson** met with legislative appropriators to present the PUC's annual budget for fiscal year 2021. The full legislature gave favorable consideration to the PUC's budget and Governor Kristi Noem signed state government's general appropriations bill on March 27, 2020.

# **GRAIN WAREHOUSE**

The Public Utilities Commission is responsible for monitoring the South Dakota grain industry. To reduce producer risk, the PUC's Warehouse Program licenses and inspects state-licensed grain storage warehouses, federally-licensed grain storage warehouses holding state grain-buyer licenses, grain buyers licensed as processors and non-storage facilities. Grain brokers and truck-based grain buyers are also licensed but not inspected because they do not maintain facilities in South Dakota.

The PUC uses three main categories, inspections, licenses and license revocations, to measure its effectiveness in the grain industry, plus other major happenings in the PUC's grain program in 2020.

### INSPECTIONS

Inspections ensure compliance with statutes and rules related to the licensing and bonding requirements for grain warehouses and grain buyers. The number of inspections describes the penetration of the program's review process. State law requires that each licensed facility receive one inspection each year. The current PUC inspection process typically results in each facility being inspected once every six to nine months.

### Measurement, 2020

Grain warehouse and grain buyer inspections: 492 inspections at 351 licensed facilities

### LICENSES

The PUC issues licenses for grain buyers and grain warehouses doing business in the state. Each licensed entity is required to apply for renewal annually. As part of the licensing and renewal process, the commission reviews financial statements and analyzes grain buyers' ability to pay grain producers and suppliers. The number of licenses handled by the PUC depicts the wide scope of the commission's monitoring of the industry.

Measurement, 2020

- Class A Grain Buyer Licenses (entities that use voluntary credit sale contracts or exceed \$5,000,000 in annual purchases): 114 entities with 284 locations.
- Class B Grain Buyer Licenses (entities that do not use voluntary credit sale contracts and do not exceed \$5,000,000 in annual purchases): 63 entities with 64 locations.
- State Warehouse Licenses (entities that store grain for hire): 47 entities with 66 locations; one out-of-state.
- Federal Warehouse Licenses (entities that are licensed by the USDA to store grain for hire): 32 entities with 151 locations; 11 out-of-state locations maintain a South Dakota grain buyer license.
- Processors (entities that purchase grain for the purpose of processing it into other products): 26 entities with 44 locations; 13 out-of-state locations maintain a South Dakota grain buyer license.
- Non-storage (entities that operate a grain handling facility but do not hold a state or federal warehouse license): 17 entities with 22 locations; four out-of-state locations.
- Truck (entities that are primarily trucking companies with no grain handling facility but purchase grain for the purpose of resale): 13 entities with five in-state and eight out-of-state locations.
- Brokers (entities that purchase grain but do not take physical possession of the grain): 42 entities with three in-state and 39 out-of-state locations.

## LICENSE REVOCATIONS

If a licensed warehouse fails to meet its obligations to its producers, the PUC follows prescribed laws and administrative rules to investigate, audit or take necessary action to limit damage to the public. Though we work diligently to minimize producer risk, some license revocations cannot be avoided.

Measurement, 2020 License Revocations: None

# **CONSUMER AFFAIRS**

The PUC provides a number of services for consumers. The agency's consumer affairs staff is trained to assist consumers with issues related to their electric, natural gas or telecommunications service, including wireless. They provide educational information about energy efficiency, consumer protection and making wise utility choices. They offer guidance and referrals for consumers who may have difficulty paying their utility bills. The commission also administers the South Dakota Do Not Call Registry, registering telephone solicitors, helping to enroll consumers on the registry, and investigating violations against consumers who are on the registry.

The commission examines the following areas to evaluate its performance in this field:

# **CONSUMER COMPLAINTS & ASSISTANCE**

Assisted consumers on 1,268 occasions with issues and complaints related to electric, natural gas, telecommunications (including wireless), pipeline siting, energy efficiency and other utility-related topics.

### **Complaints Resolved Within a Month**

Consumer complaints are received by the commission via phone, mail, email and, occasionally, inperson. The PUC strives to quickly and fully investigate each incident by analyzing both sides of the complaint and working with the affected parties to informally reach a resolution. The number of complaints resolved within a month reveals the commission's effectiveness in responding to consumers. The goal is 90% resolved within a month.

Measurement, 2020 Complaints resolved within a month: 98%

### **Formal Consumer Complaints**

When a consumer and utility cannot reach a resolution through the informal process, one of the parties may file a formal complaint. A formal complaint is entered into a docket and, unless settled, may result in a hearing before the commission. The commission endeavors to affect complaint resolutions informally and therefore strives for a low number of formal complaints. This measurement is also an assessment of the PUC staff's negotiation and mediation skills.

Measurement, 2020 Formal consumer complaints: None

## DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

The commission continually uses outreach efforts to educate South Dakotans about enrolling their personal telephone number on the Do Not Call Registry to reduce the number of telemarketing calls they receive. In addition to advocacy, the PUC takes an active role and, at the request of a consumer, will enroll their number on the registry. The PUC tracks the number of South Dakota telephone numbers on the registry, noting the amount of growth each year which is an indication of the success of education efforts.

Measurement, 2020 South Dakota telephone numbers on Do Not Call Registry: 694,657 (1% increase)

### **PUBLIC OUTREACH**

Visited with more than 550 consumers about the purpose and services of the PUC at the Sioux Falls Home Show in March. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the PUC was unable to host a booth at the Black Hills Home Show in Rapid City and South Dakota State Fair in Huron as they have in past years.

# LEADERSHIP AND COMMISSIONER OUTREACH

Commissioners hold a number of leadership roles with national and regional organizations. Here is a look at their roles in 2020. They also engage with South Dakota consumers, students, industry professionals and community leaders through many public gatherings each year.

### SOUTH DAKOTA PUC

**Commissioner Gary Hanson** served as PUC chairman and **Commissioner Chris Nelson** as vice chairman in 2020.

### MID-AMERICA REGULATORY CONFERENCE

**Chairman Gary Hanson** was elected president of the Mid-America Regulatory Conference. MARC is an association of utility regulatory agencies from Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas and Wisconsin. Hanson had previously served two years as vice president, two years as secretary and one year as treasurer. As MARC president, Hanson led presentations to the membership at their fall meeting.

### SOUTHWEST POWER POOL

**Commissioner Kristie Fiegen** served as vice president of the Southwest Power Pool's Regional State Committee, which is tasked with overseeing the fulfillment of the on-target, customer-driven goals of SPP as it provides bulk transmission, reliability and market services to transmission companies, utilities and end-use customers in the region.

### NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF REGULATORY UTILITY COMMISSIONERS

**Vice Chair Chris Nelson** continued serving as chairman of NARUC's Broadband Expansion Task Force and co-chair of the organization's Washington Action Program. He is also a member of the group's board of directors and Investment Committee.

### **PUBLIC ENGAGEMENTS**

**Chairman Gary Hanson** offered a glimpse of the PUC's role and responsibilities to members of the South Dakota AFL/CIO and South Dakota Rural Electric Association managers at the groups' annual gatherings in Pierre. He also spoke to more than a dozen service organizations throughout the state to enhance awareness of how the PUC serves and protects South Dakota's consumers.

Vice Chairman Chris Nelson met with several school and utility industry groups, sharing expertise and leading discussions on such topics as spectrum, the Rural Digital Opportunity Fund, wind energy, electric generation mix, technology divide, the telecommunications aspect of transactive energy, and broadband. Audiences and events receiving his messages included Newell, Chamberlain and South Dakota School of Mines and Technology students; National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners conferences; South Dakota AFL/CIO members; National Regulatory Research Institute webinar; Oscher Lifelong Learning Institute participants; Transactive Energy Systems Conference; Valley Telecommunications Reconnect award announcement; NTCA-The Rural Broadband Association members; and Utilities Technology Council members.

**Commissioner Kristie Fiegen** shared her passion for consumer protection in presentations to students from Chamberlain and Newell. Fiegen also led a question and answer session for legislative interns and pages about the PUC. As a leader on the Regional State Committee of the Southwest Power Pool, Fiegen also gave her perspective during several presentations to regional transmission organizations throughout the year.

# 2020 REGULATED UTILITY COMPANIES

The commission has territory, complaint and quality of service authority over all natural gas, electric and telecommunications utilities operating within South Dakota. Certain utilities are exempt from the commission's rate regulation. They include municipal, rural electric cooperatives and small, independent and cooperative telephone companies. The commission retains the switched access rate making authority for all telecommunications companies providing local service, including small, independent and cooperative companies.


